1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and Ald. King gave the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Oct. 27, 1980, regular meeting and Nov. 10, 1980, 7:30 a.m. special meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: (a) Ald. King made a motion to adopt the attached resolution regarding Steve Pischke's efforts on the 1980A bond issue, 2nd by Ald. Cox with Ald. Pack and Ald. Lewis voting affirmatively also.
(b) Mayor Burdette stated the City's general election would be held on Nov. 19, 1980, at the county courthouse.
4. Aldermen's Comments: None
5. Public Comments: (a) A first reading was given to the request of James David (Jimmy) Gee's application for a pawn shop license at 208 S. Wall Street, including permission to sell firearms. He has received state permission on the firearm sells.
6. Old Business: (a) The beer license request for Ed Bays has been tabled at this time as per the request of Mr. Bays.
(b) Mayor Burdette reported that according to the City Attorney there was no legal avenue available to loan the Calhoun Woman's Club the funds to publish the history of their club.
(c) City Supt. James Hobgood reported that 500 ft. of curb had been installed on Sequoyah Terrace; water line replacement on Circle Drive should be complete this week; Street Dept. is installing drainage tile and working on the proposed road at the raw water intake site in order to make the area accessible to bidders on the project; traffic lights being mounted at Richardson Road should be in service by the end of the week. Paving contracts received for King Street and work on Beamer Road from the Dept. of Transportation. Supt. Hobgood announced a public hearing to be held the first Tuesday in December, 1980, local industrial leaders will be notified of the hearing.
(d) A copy of the audit for the 12" water line construction project financed by a \$60,000.00 state grant and \$60,000.00 FmHA grant was presented to the Council. The City paid the over run of \$5,971.44 as outlined in the audit.


