


1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Sept. 28, 1981, regular city council meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: (a) Mayor Burdette reminded the Council of a public official's personal liability workshop scheduled at Berry College on Oct. 29, 1981, from 11:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.
4. Aldermen's Comments: None
5. Public Comments: (a) Mr. Sam Barbour, representing 49 petitioners, from Crestmont Subdivision asked for some assistance with the dangerous entrance/exit to the subdivision on East Line (Dews Pond Road). The Council and City Supt. discussed the situation with the group. It was decided to erect another caution signal east of the intersection before the curve. The Supt. is to ask planning assistance from the Dept. of Transportation during the next couple of weeks. Sewerage for the area was discussed also.
6. Old Business: (a) City Supt. Jim Hobgood stated all of the 2.25 miles of paving had been completed except for Oak Street and it looks good. Piping and ditching has been corrected on Cove Street and 700' of storm drainage has been installed for Krystal.
938' of the sewer line has been installed on the Kenmoreland project. Project looks good so far, not as much rock as was anticipated. Project approximately 1/3 complete.
There is about 1500 ft. of water line remaining on the FmHA contract # 4. The estimated cost for 900' of sidewalk, 450' retaining wall, curb & gutter for the old Red Bud Road is approximately \$15,000.00
- (b) Purchasing Agent Hoyt Edwards presented bids on 621 Caterpillar Tractor and scrape. Yancey, Atlanta, GA - \$196,796.00; Tompson Tractor Co., Inc., Birmingham, Ala. - \$228,646.00; Carlton Co., Albany GA - \$244,750.00; Stowers Machinery Corp. - \$252,245.00. The equipment to be used at the landfill full time. Ald. Cox made a motion to accept the low bid provided the County share one-half the cost according to the landfill agreement, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Pack and Ald. Lewis voting affirmatively also. Prices on the police car from Williams Chevrolet \$8878.00 for a 1981 vehicle were compared to \$8943.00 for a 1982 Ford vehicle. Ald. Lewis made a motion to table consideration of a police car for two weeks, Oct. 26, 1981. 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Pack and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
- (c) Stan Emory of Hensley-Schmidt presented an agreement for the Council to consider covering work for the waste treatment plant other than as authorized on the EPA 201 contract. After discussion, the Council asked that work be done job by job and presented to the Council for approval before any work is started.
Mr. Emory reported that water/sewer plans for the Industrial Park were to be hand delivered to EDA and EPD on Oct. 13, 1981, and bids taken around the first of December, 1981, and awarded around the first of the year.
7. New Business: (a) Ald. Lewis made a motion to adopt a resolution accepting a grant for \$50,000.00 from EPD for a pan for the landfill, and to authorize the Mayor to sign the contract, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Pack and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
- (b) Ald. Cox made a motion to adopt a resolution for the City to accept the role of lead agent in the above mentioned EPD grant, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Lewis

and Ald. Pack voting affirmatively also.


- 8. Ald. Lewis made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. Cox and Ald. King voting affirmatively also.
