

SEPT. 13, 1982 - 7:30 P.M. REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING WITH MAYOR BURDETTE,  
ALD. LEWIS, ALD. COX, ALD. KING AND ALD. PACK IN ATTENDANCE

1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Aug. 23, 1982, regular Council meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: (a) Mayor Burdette read the resolution previously authorized by the Council regarding Harold Kirby's forty-two years of service to the City.
- (b) Mayor Burdette read a resolution recognizing Alton "Bud" Harris for thirty years of service with the street department as of July 1, 1982, and presented him a gold watch in honor of the occasion.
- (c) Mayor Burdette stated that due to several complaints from parents regarding school crossings not being manned properly, he had asked Asst. Chief Mitchell to find out how Dalton handled this situation. He reported that Dalton has 19 crossings manned by part time help for approximately two hours per day. They are furnished two uniforms per year and are paid \$7.80 per hour. Mayor Burdette stated that he would like for the Council to consider similar action to cover three crossings, and take action no later than the next regular meeting.
5. Public Comments: (a) Jim Shellnut a representative of Amway Products presented a test of gasoline mileage for the Police Dept. for the months of July and August, using a gasoline additive the latter month which showed a reduced net cost of operation. After further discussion, Ald. King made a motion to discontinue the test and use of the product, 2nd by Ald. Lewis with Ald. Pack and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
- (b) Part of the new officers and directors for the Downtown Development Authority Tim Haney, President, Kay White, Secretary-Treasurer, and Farrell Palmer, Director, expressed their appreciation for the Council's vote of confidence and pledged their efforts in making the Authority a success.
- (c) A clean police report was given on the Kenneth Lee Holcomb amusement license request for the former Country House Restaurant location on Highway 53 West. After a discussion on the number of pool tables and other machines for the proposed location, Ald. Pack made a motion to deny the request, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Lewis and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also. Mayor Burdette asked that his concurrence be recorded.
- (d) Ald. Lewis made a motion to condemn the old Johnson Laundry building on College Street, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Pack and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
6. Old Business: (a) A general discussion was held on HB #1358 and the City's method of compliance. Ald. Lewis made a motion to pay \$20.00 per day to police officers being required to appear in municipal court on off duty days; but to allow compensating time off for those appearing in municipal court early on a normal work day and no compensation for those on duty. 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Cox and Ald. Pack voting affirmatively also.
- (b) A first reading was given to the Nuisance Abatement Ordinance.
- (c) General discussion was held on a proposed Interstate Sign Ordinance. The Mayor asked that the matter be reviewed and discussed again on Sept. 27, 1982.
- (d) A first reading was given to the George Chambers annexation ordinance request for lot located off Peters Farm Road, for R-1 zoning.


