

FEB. 28, 1983 - 7:30 P.M. REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING WITH MAYOR BURDETTE,
ALD. LEWIS, ALD. KING, ALD. MEADOWS AND ALD. BENNETT IN ATTENDANCE

1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
2. Minutes of the Feb. 14, 1983, regular city council meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments:
 - (a) Mayor Burdette made a recommendation that the following assistant department heads be appointed:
 - Kelly Cornwell - Electric Supt. in Training
 - Jerry Quinn - Asst. Fire Chief
 - Max Mashburn - Asst. Water Plant Supt.

Ald. King made a motion to make these appointments, 2nd by Ald Bennett with Ald. Lewis and Ald. Meadows voting affirmatively also.
4. Aldermen's Comments: None
5. Public Comments:
 - (a) A discussion regarding the current business license governing taxi cab companies was held. Ald. King was appointed to research and make a recommendation back to the Council regarding the required insurance coverage.
 - (b) A public hearing was given on the Charles F. Tschinkel beer license request for the property formerly known as Jack's Hamburgers on Highway 53 East. No public comments were made, and a clear police report was given. Ald. Lewis made a motion to approve the license, 2nd by Ald. Meadows with Ald. King and Ald. Bennett voting affirmatively also. Mayor Burdette asked that his strong opposition to the license be recorded.
 - (c) A public hearing was held on the pawn shop license request for Classic Gifts Ltd., Hugh Dell and Dollie West, for 507 S. Wall St. No public comments were made and a clear police report was given. Ald. Meadows made a motion to approve the license, 2nd by Ald. Bennett with Ald. Lewis and Ald. King voting affirmatively also.
6. Old Business:
 - (a) A second reading was given to the Dick Tribble annexation ordinance request for lots 5 & 6 of block A, Morningside Addition off East May St. for R-2 zoning; Ald. Bennett made a motion to waive the 3rd & 4th readings and adopt, 2nd by Ald. Meadows with Ald. Lewis and Ald. King voting affirmatively also. (ordinance no. 86)
 - (b) A second reading was given to the Utah Knight annexation ordinance request for lot 7 of block A, Morningside Addition off East May St., for R-2 zoning; Ald. Lewis made a motion to waive the 3rd & 4th readings and approve, 2nd by Ald. Meadows with Ald. King and Ald. Bennett voting affirmatively also. (ordinance no. 87)
 - (c) City Supt. Hobgood reported on the valve problem at the water plant and methods to repair when materials arrive; reported on the electrical starter problems with the raw water pump station, electrical contractor to change out this week; surge tank on New Town Rd complete except for painting; oil problem with the center pump at the new intake, contractor to repair; Eslinger Contracting doing pressure tests on lines they have installed. Street Dept. doing storm drainage work on Red Bud and Dews Pond connector road; Supt. to have complete drawings made and bids taken for the sewer line work on West Belmont and Milton Stewart's apartment sites, returned to Council for their determination of work to be done. Supt. Hobgood reported that according to private lab analysis, the sludge from Goodyear does not presently meet the city's sewer ordinance specifications and can not infiltrate the city's system.
7. New Business:
 - (a) A wine license application was presented by Charles D. Thomason, Speedy's Spirit Shop for the location on I-75, Highway 53 East, south side. A public hearing was set for March 14, 1983, at 7:30 p.m.
 - (b) Bids were opened on police cars, they were: Prater Ford, 1983 LTD, \$8,974.00; Williams Chevrolet, 1983 Impala, \$9,800.45; 1982 Chevrolet, \$9,175.00. Ald. King made a motion to accept the low bid of \$8,974.00, Prater Ford, 2nd by Ald. Meadows with Ald. Lewis and Ald. Bennett voting affirmatively also.

- (c) A discussion followed on the necessity of having a police terminal for checking previous cases of violators with the State in order to fulfill the requirements of the new DUI regulations. Police Commissioner King and Clerk Harrison were authorized to check current cost and to work in the current police budget if possible.
 - (d) The City Supt. was authorized by the Council to post "No Parking" signs on the west side of North Wall Street in front of First Federal and Chance/Maddox law offices.
 - (e) A discussion followed on the \$5,815.19 in 1977 utility accounts deemed uncollectable, and Ald. Bennett made a motion to charge off the accounts which represent approximately one tenth of one percent of the accounts billed for the year, 2nd by Ald. Lewis with Ald. King and Ald. Meadows voting affirmatively also.
 - (f) A rezoning request was given for Terry Allen Smith for the property formerly known as the church building on Oothcaloga Street, 53 Spur, Paul Rapp property. The current zoning being R-3, requested to be changed to C-2. A public hearing was set for March 14, 1983.
8. Ald. King made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Bennett with Ald. Lewis and Ald. Meadows voting affirmatively also.
