1. Mayor Meadows called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
2. Mayor Meadows led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. Flag.
3. Minutes of the November 13, 1989 regular meeting were approved.
4. Mayor's Comments:
 - (a) Mayor Meadows swore in Dr. James Holloway as City School Superintendent.
 - (b) Superintendent Holloway announced the excellent test scores recently received by the high school. He also announced the school system was moving toward community education, and might possibly ask that an office for the Community Education Director be reserved in the renovated depot.
 - (c) Mayor Meadows accepted the resignation of Henry Holland from the Zoning Advisory Board. He expressed his appreciation for his service. The Council was asked to consider a replacement prior to the December 4, 1989 meeting.
 - (d) Mayor Meadows announced the public hearings scheduled for December 4, 1989 at 7:30 P.M. They are: annexations - Charles Holcomb, Lots 5,6,30,31 of Rogers Subdivision for C-2 zoning; Gordon Lay, Ovell and Marguerite Dutton and Paul Holbrook for .45 acres each off West Belmont Drive for C-2 zoning; Julian Fuller zoning change request for 7.5 acres off West Belmont Drive for change from R-2 to C-2; G. Gosain, manager for Julia's Seafood Restaurant for beer pouring application, and a hearing on a proposed ordinance regarding misdemeanor violations for municipal court.
 - (e) Mayor Meadows announced a City/County work session for Tuesday, November 21, 1989 at 9:00 A.M. at the City Superintendent's office on West Line Street.
5. There were no public hearings.
6. Old Business:
 - (a) Following a review of the Revolving Loan request amendment of Dr. Patricia Tygrett, and a recommendation by the Revolving Loan Advisory Committee, Councilman Oldfield made a motion to leave the terms of the loan as originally approved, 2nd by Councilman Bond with Councilman Oldfield, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively.
 - (b) Councilman Oldfield made a motion to approve and authorize the signing of the order of the Wood's dog classification hearing, 2nd by Councilman Bond with Councilman Oldfield, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively.
7. New Business:
 - (a) A 1st reading was given to the following beer-wine-liquor store renewal license request for 1990: ABC Oasis Package Store, James D. Thomason; American Legion, Dewitt Carter, mgr.; The Beer Store, Phillip Beamer; Got-M-Inc., Richard C. Trimble; Handy-Go Market, Charles McRee; Holiday Inn Restaurant, Greta Hayes; Highway 53 Package, Terry G. Ross; Louie's Package Store, Louie D. & Faye Worley; Murphy's, Thomas J. McCary, Jr.; North 41 Package, Richard

- (c) A 1st reading was given to a zoning variance request by John Bruce for 7 feet to allow a sign on South Wall Street, across from the former Troy's Restaurant. Mayor Pro-Tem King made a motion to set the public hearing for December 18, 1989 at 7:30 P.M., 2nd by Councilman Bond with Mayor Pro-Tem King, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Councilman Oldfield voting affirmatively, motion carried.
8. City Superintendent Hobgood stated the work at the waste treatment facility is about thirty days ahead of schedule at this point, with all concrete walls up at this point. The water/sewer construction requests have dropped considerably. The Street Department and Landfill Department continue to work at the landfill. The offset at Marine Drive has been corrected at the intersection of Marine Drive, Flowers and Richardson Roads.
9. Councilman Oldfield made a motion to move to Executive Session for personnel discussion, 2nd by Councilman Bond with Councilman Oldfield, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively, motion carried.
10. Councilman Oldfield made a motion to move to General Session, 2nd by Councilman Bond with Councilman Oldfield, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively, motion carried.
11. Councilman Oldfield made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Councilman Bond, with Councilman Oldfield, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively.
