1. Chairman Ellis Hite called the meeting to order.
2. Discussion continued on the landfill. Mayor Meadows stated if the City pursued acquiring a sanitary permit, the fees adopted on November 3, 1989 under item 2, would be correct with the deletion of the last portion of item 2, beginning with the third paragraph and continuing for the balance of item 2.

John Myers stated the two new lifts are for the current sanitary side. The goal is to extend the life of the existing site until the new site is open.

James Hobgood gave a history of why the City currently has an industrial permit. He reviewed (by means of posters) the current area presently being used by the County and the City in their separate operations. He reviewed the available borrow pits on the site and a possible off site area owned by the estates of James Owens and Raymond King. This site would require hauling, but there would be no charge for the material. Mr. Hobgood also discussed the site being operated entirely under a sanitary permit and consolidation of employees under one supervisor. Myers stated the DNO plan could be amended with possibly a thirty day period to change from an industrial permit to a sanitary permit for the City. Consolidation of employees under one supervisor, for one permitted operation would call for additional equipment. The discussion continued on the pros and cons of a consolidated sanitary operation. Mayor Meadows stated the City would proceed with a sanitary permit application. The City Council endorsed the consolidation concept. Commissioners Chitwood, Crump and Chairman Hite agreed that consolidation of the landfill operation was the most efficient and practical approach. A deadline of January 1, 1990 for implementation of fees was discussed but did not give enough time for an ordinance to be adopted and billing procedures put in place.

Mayor Meadows stated the City has a ten wheel front end loader which under the present feeschedule would cost over \$50,000.00 annually for dumping at the site. He stated in view of the funds presently being paid by the City for landfill operations, he did not think it was appropriate for the City to pay this charge also. Mayor Meadows stated the City presently has two industrial customers which it will divert to another carrier. There was no consensus on the matter, and the County members stated they would meet independently and get back together later.

John Myers stated he had received the test results of surface water from both sites and there was no problem.

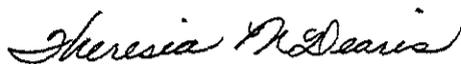
John Myers produced estimated capital and operating costs for the next twenty-five years at the new site for the group to review.

3. Superintendent Hobgood stated he had received an estimated price of \$600,000.00 to \$640,000.00 for a four-lane at Union Grove Road. Mr. Hobgood stated with the use of City/County labor on the base, the cost might be lower. He asked that he and Julian James be allowed to discuss.
