1. Mayor Meadows called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
2. Mayor Meadows led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. Flag.
3. Minutes of the November 12, 1990 Regular City Council Meeting were approved.
4. Mayor's Comments:
 - a. Mayor Meadows congratulated H.A. Oldfield, Jr., John D. Shelton, Jimmy Palmer, Judy Wilson and Becky Mathews on their recent election.
 - b. Mayor Meadows reminded the Council of the Zoning Variance Hearing on December 10, 1990 for the 9 ft. variance at 113 Fain Street for James S. Mathews.
 - c. Mayor Meadows reminded the Council and public of the Mayor's Motorcade to N.W. Regional Hospital on December 14, 1990 and requested people to send gifts for the occasion to City Hall.
 - d. Mayor Meadows stated the Friday night Moonlight Madness Celebration was very nice this year.
 - e. Mayor Meadows reminded everyone that the National Guard Armory Personnel would be leaving for Fort Stewart December 3, 1990. He stated that a good bye party was scheduled for Saturday evening at 6:00 P.M.

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- f. Following a discussion of proposed Commercial Dumpster Pick-up Charges to cover New Landfill Dumping Charges, Mayor Pro-Tem King made a motion to authorize that an Ordinance be drawn as per the recommendation of the Director of Utilities/Public Works, \$1.50 per cubic yard, 2nd by Councilman Bond with Mayor Pro-Tem King, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Councilman Oldfield voting affirmatively, motion carried.
- g. The following proposed members for the City's Transportation Advisory Group were asked to serve: Milton Stewart, Mary Richie, Larry Roye, Henry Holland, and Jimmy Silvers plus Tom Bond and Herbert King from the Council.

7. New Business:

- a. Jay Manay of the CARE Group presented a recycling proposal for the Council to review and ask for a joint City/County Officials Meeting. A tentative date of December 13, 1990 at 5:30 P.M. was set.
- b. Police Chief Mitchell stated after due consideration that he had selected Randy Jackson to serve as Assistant Chief effective January 1, 1991. He stated that Mr. Jackson was selected from ten applicants.
- c. Councilman Oldfield made a motion to authorize the placement of signs on the road right-of-way at Greenrow indicating no vending, 2nd by Mayor Pro-Tem King with Councilman Oldfield, Mayor Pro-Tem King, Councilman Shelton and Councilman Bond voting affirmatively, motion carried.
- d. Following a review of a Proposed electric Mutual Aid Agreement recommended by Electric Cities establishing ground rules for sending or receiving mutual aid on a volunteer basis, Councilman Bond made a motion to approve and authorize the Mayor to sign, 2nd by Councilman Oldfield with Councilman Bond, Councilman Oldfield, Councilman Shelton and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively, motion carried.

 - j. The Gregory B. Stamey Amusement License Application for 344 South Wall Street was reviewed. A clear police report was given. The Council held for more information since the area adjoins a beer package store.
 - k. A 1st reading was given to a Zoning Change Request of Ola Yarborough of 231 McConnell Road to change Lot. Nos. 68 & 69 from R-2 to C-2 to allow construction of a sandwich shop. Councilman Oldfield made a motion to set the Public Hearing for December 17, 1990 at 7:30 P.M., 2nd by Councilman Bond with Councilman Oldfield, Councilman bond, Councilman Shelton and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively, motion carried.
8. Director of Utilities/Public Works Report - none.
 9. Councilman Oldfield made a motion to move to Executive Session for Real Estate Matters, 2nd by Mayor Pro-Tem King with Councilman Oldfield, Mayor Pro-Tem King, Councilman Shelton and Councilman Bond voting affirmatively, motion carried.
 10. Mayor Pro-Tem King made a motion to move to General Session, 2nd by Councilman Bond with Mayor Pro-Tem King, Councilman Bond, Councilman Shelton and Councilman Oldfield voting affirmatively, motion carried.
 11. Councilman Shelton made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Councilman Oldfield with Councilman Shelton, Councilman Oldfield, Councilman Bond and Mayor Pro-Tem King voting affirmatively, motion carried.
