

SEPTEMBER 28, 1981 - 7:30 P.M. REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING WITH MAYOR BURDETTE,  
ALD LEWIS, ALD. COX, ALD. KING AND ALD. PACK IN ATTENDANCE

1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and Ald. King gave the invocation.
  2. Minutes of the Sept. 14, 1981 regular meeting were read and approved.
  3. Mayor's Comments: (a) Mayor Burdette commended the City Fire Chief and members of the Fire Dept., Captain Dan Autry, Kenny Fuquea and Mike Caldwell for their services at the train wreck and diesel fuel fire on the Oostanaula Road recently. He asked that their volunteer efforts be made a part of their personnel files.
  4. Aldermen's Comments:
  5. Public Comments: (a) Mrs. Nathan Ware requested a uniform guard at Red Bud and Barrett Roads for school crossings. Police Commissioner Ald. Lewis stated that he and Chief Davis would try to work out something.
  - (b) A clear police report was given on the book store/pawn shop license request for Kenneth McEntyre, but license approval was held until a location has been secured and approved.
  6. Old Business: (a) Discussion was held by the Council with residents of the old Red Bud Road area. Written requests on the road was 16 votes for one way, (14 from Nelson to New Red Bud Road and 2 from the light to the New Red Bud Road), and 14 votes to leave the street as it is. Ald. Lewis made a motion to leave the street as it is due to the heavy split among the residents, 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. Cox and Ald. King voting affirmatively also. Mayor Burdette asked that the record reflect his opposition to two lanes due to the safety factor.
  - (b) Clerk Harrison reported the advertising on the sale of public property on North 41, bound by John Allen King Dairy property, would begin Sept. 30, 1981 and bids would be opened on Oct. 26, 1981.
  - (c) Mark Stendahl of Hensley-Schmidt reported that the responses had been prepared to the questions from EPA concerning the application to phase two of the EPA 201 grant. He reported there was still some hope that Phase two would be federally funded, and we should know by December. Mr. Stendahl stated that after reviewing the City's current bonded debt on the water-sewer system he would not advise any further debt at this time. He stated that a part of the project could be funded with local capital budget funds during two budget years. The Council agreed that no decisions should be made until the first of the year in order to determine the status of the grant. Ald. Lewis made a motion to amend the original phase two application and to authorize the Mayor to sign these amendments. 2nd by Ald. Cox with Ald. King and Ald. Pack voting affirmatively also.
- The South Industrial water/sewer plans are ready for approval by EPA, ARC, and EDA.
- Airport project has a hold at this point due to a find during the archological study as required by the state.
- (d) City Supt. Jim Hobgood reported that the Street Dept. had been doing storm drainage work and cutting right-of-way at the airport.
- Dalton has requested the Southern Natural Gas line be cased on the Beamer Road. We whould have some relief on the paving project within two weeks.

The contracts on the water extension and water in-take have been awarded. Acceptance by contractors should be received within ten days.

Have easements for approximately 1000 ft. of sewer line on the Kenmoreland sewer project.

Sewer line has been extended to the Housing Authority building site on Highway 53. Building of the road to the site is progressing. North Georgia Paving is doing the work and the City will submit the road cost to the Housing Authority for reimbursement.


- 7. New Business: (a) Ald. Cox made a motion to approve the maintenance agreement and authorize the Mayor to sign the paving contract for 2.265 miles of paving for the following streets:

2nd by Ald. Lewis with Ald Pack and Ald. King voting affirmatively also.

- (b) Ald. Cox made a motion to adopt a resolution covering the acquisition and clearance of right-of-ways for the above streets, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Pack and Ald. Lewis voting affirmatively also.
  - (c) Clerk Harrison stated that Monday, Sept. 28, 1981, was the first day of qualifying for the Nov. 18, 1981, city election. Those who qualified were: Mayor W. C. Burdette; Alderman Post 1 - Edward Lewis; - Alderman Post 2 - Herbert King and City Board of Education Post 5- Dick Shelton.
  - (d) Ald. Lewis made a motion allowing the City Clerk Cathy Harrison to accept the position of President of the Georgia Municipal Clerk's and Finance Officers Association, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Pack and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
8. Ald. King made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. Lewis and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
