1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
 2. Minutes of the Oct. 23, 1979, meeting were read and approved.
 3. Mayor's Comments: (a) Mayor Burdette announced the charter/code meeting scheduled with Representative Ralston and Senator Langford on Nov. 15, 1979, at 7:30 p.m., city courtroom.
 4. Aldermen's Comments: None
 5. Public Comments: (a) Mr. Austin Knight requested a booking for the new auditorium in 1980. The Council requested that Mr. Knight check with City Hall on Tuesday, since guidelines would be adopted later in the meeting regarding booking of the new auditorium.
(b) Clerk Harrison reported to the Council that the 1969 minutes had been researched and no reference had been found regarding Betty Ferguson Holbrook's sewer easement. After discussion and the City Attorney's report regarding the Council's legal obligation on the easement, the Council declined to pay the cost of extending sewer services to the area.
(c) Mrs. June Bearden requested a free tap for a house the Red Bud Booster Club plans to build on Sylvan Drive as a community project to raise funds for their school athletic programs. Ald. Pack made a motion to grant the request, 2nd by Ald. Cox, with Ald. King and Ald. Lewis voting affirmatively also. Ald. Lewis commented that similar requests should all be viewed carefully.
(d) Linda Cochran presented a request for an amusement license for 204 Park Ave. in the name of James Hyde. After discussion, Ald. Cox made a motion to approve the request, 2nd by Ald. Lewis with Ald. King and Ald. Pack voting affirmatively also.
(e) Billy Moore made a request to annex the former Jiffy Market building and apartments at the Arch. Mr. Moore was requested to obtain the proper application and present to the Clerk for the next meeting.
 6. Old Business: (a) City Administrator Edwards reported the results of the vehicle sale on Nov. 3, 1979. The 4 pickups sold for more than the minimum price allowed, but the two ton GMC truck did not sale.
(b) City Administrator Edwards stated that he had been notified of the City being recognized as a certified city and announced that the award would be given on Nov. 30 at the Governor's Award banquet in Atlanta.
(c) Supt. Hobgood stated that ground work at the auditorium had been finished, and paving would be done shortly. The Dept. of Transportation is issuing a paving contract on the project. The curtains are not ready, but a part of them should be ready by the date of the Junior Miss Pageant. Richardson Road is ready for paving to be done down to the south driveway of Challenge-Cook. The balance will be held until all sewer lines to adjoining property have been installed. The 42" line across Meadow Lane did an excellent job on water flow over the weekend. The I-75 sewer line has been completed except for setting the lift station and work on Highway 41.
(d) The Council held a general discussion on the present zoning committee procedures. The Council asked Supt. Hobgood to make several inquiries and report back at the next meeting.

- 7. New Business: (a) Ald. Lewis made a motion to extend the Dec. 20, 1979, tax deadline to Dec. 31, 1979 to allow for the 60 day notification as required by state law, 2nd by Ald. Cox with Ald. Pack, Ald. King voting affirmatively also. (b) Clerk Harrison presented uncollectable utility accounts to the Council and asked that they be studied and reviewed again at the next meeting. (c) Bids on the city's liability vehicle coverage were opened:

 Public Risk Managrs, Inc. - American Southern Ins. Co. - \$16,344.00
 Stanley Lachman Co., Inc., Melvin Greeson - Home Indemnity Co., Inc. - \$17,888.00
 Ald. Lewis made a motion to accept the low bid of \$13,361.00 from Starr-Mathews, 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. Cox and Ald. King voting affirmatively also. (d) The budget to actual expense and income for the first quarter of 1979-80 was discussed.
- 8. Ald. Lewis made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. Cox and Ald. King voting affirmatively also.
- 9. Ald. Lewis made a motion to reconvene at 10:58 p.m., 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. King and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
- 10. Ald. King made a motion to approve the amended auditorium guidelines as per the attached, 2nd by Ald. Lewis with Ald. Cox and Ald. Pack voting affirmatively also.
- 11. Ald. Pack made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Cox and Ald. Lewis voting affirmatively also.
