

1. Mayor Burdette called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.
2. Minutes of the July 23, 1979, regular meeting and the July 31, 1979, special meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: (a) Mayor Burdette announced a GMA meeting regarding a newly formed Task Force on Revenue Sharing. He stated that he would be attending a 7th District officers meeting in Atlanta on Thursday and Friday, Aug. 16 and 17.
- (b) Mayor Burdette congratulated Harold "Slim" Kirby on his 39th year with the City as of Aug. 1, 1979.
4. Aldermen's Comments: None
5. Public Comments: (a) Ross Wilburn requested the Council allow him a \$75.00 credit on his current curb and gutter bill for the use of pipe he had previously paid for. After discussion, the Council voted not to allow the credit due to precedent that it would set, because existing policy does not allow credit for existing installed pipe. Aldmen Cox, Lewis and King voted to uphold policy, Ald. Pack voted to allow the credit.
- (b) Max Henson requested permission to locate a trailer to be used as a barber shop to be located on the lot next to McEntyre Grocery on Highway 41, South. After disclosing that permission for trailers is allowed only for six months period, Mr. Henson withdrew the request.
- (c) Mrs. Juanita Hunt requested the City to supply water-sewerage to several acres on Barrett Road abutting the Hunt's Subdivision on the North. Mrs. Hunt stated her desire to sell the property for construction of rent subsidized apartments. After discussion, the Council asked Mrs. Hunt to file an application for annexation, stating the required zoning, and submit to the Council and the Zoning Board for a recommendation.
- (d) Mr. William C. Page of 1105 South Wall Street requested permission to locate a trailer on his lot behind his home. The trailer would be occupied by his daughter and her children during her convalescence. Ald. Lewis made a motion to grant the request for a six months temporary permit, under hardship conditions, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Cox and Ald. Pack voting affirmatively also.
6. Old Business: (a) Ald. Lewis made a motion to extend the Beamer Gin building condemnation from July 9, 1979, until Oct. 9, 1979. 2nd by Ald. Cox with Ald. King and Ald. Pack voting affirmatively also.
- (b) A public hearing was held on the Danny Greeson beer application for 830 N. Wall Street, formerly J J's Package Store. Clerk Harrison announced that all advertising had been done and gave the police report which was favorable. Ald. Lewis made a motion to approve the license, 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. King and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.
- (c) City Supt. Hobgood reported that the street department had completed the ditching on Richardson Road and the area is now ready for Northwest Georgia Paving to do the grading and drainage. Supt. Hobgood reported that Tom Moreland, Director of the Dept. of Transportation stated that he would give a contract on the base and paving of Richardson Road. Supt. Hobgood stated that the street boring had been completed for the sewer line extension on ^{East} West May Street. Construction is being started on the utility extension for the rest area on 41 North. Bids will be opened on Sept. 6, 1979, at 3:00 p.m. for the 12" water line extension on North 41.

(d) Clerk Harrison gave a report on the City's group insurance, and requested the City pay the increased premium of \$818.00 in order to allow enough time to amend the coverage. Ald. Cox made a motion to pay the increased premium of \$818.00 for one month to allow time for bids to be taken on the coverage.

(c) Ald. Pack made a motion to accept the wine application of Roy Aaron and set the public hearing date for Aug. 27, 1979. 2nd by Ald. Cox with Ald. Lewis and Ald. King voting affirmatively also.

(d) Ald. Pack made a motion to accept the beer to be consumed on the premises application for Pizza Hut and set the public hearing for Aug. 27, 1979, 2nd by Ald. King with Ald. Lewis and Ald. Cox voting affirmatively also.

(e) A general discussion followed on the request to issue permits for citizens serving on the jury. Ald. Lewis, Ald. King and Ald. Cox approved allowing the Sheriff to hand out the permits, Ald. Pack voted against the request.

(f) The Council requested the Roach Estate houses directly in front of the high school be inspected and reported back to the Council.

8. Ald. King made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Pack with Ald. Cox and Ald. Lewis voting affirmatively also.
