

JULY 22, 1963 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR FRANK M. DICKINSON, ALDERMEN TOM B. DAVID, JOHN A. LEWIS, JR. AND JOHN T. WOODS, JR. PRESENT; ALDERMAN JERRY KING ON VACATION.

1. Rev. Lloyd Napier, pastor of Echota Baptist Church, opened the meeting with prayer.

2. Minutes of regular meeting of July 8 read and approved. Minutes of called meeting of July 18 read and approved.

3. Miss Mary Johnson, whose home is adjacent to the Chili Dog Drive In Restaurant, appeared before council to register her disapproval of the issuance of a business license to the Chili Dog. Council advised Miss Johnson that there were no zoning restrictions to prohibit the granting of business license to a company wishing to operate in a residential neighborhood.

4. Rev. Lloyd Napier, Floyd Brock, M. M. Hall and Jack Bell all asked council to deny Clarence Harris' request for a beer license for 712-14 N. Wall St. Ald. Lewis moved that the vote on this application be tabled until Aug. 12 meeting, 2nd by Ald. Woods and passed.

5. John D. Edge seeking extension of water main from Fairview Church to connect with Sugar Valley line, referred to Supt. Owens to see if this can be done.

6. City School Supt. G. V. Cate and Chairman of the Board of Education Paul Shoffner told of the financial dilemma of the city schools and Mr. Cate said he would need a minimum of four thousand dollars to get thru the summer. Ald. Lewis made a motion to give the schools an additional \$4,000 as money becomes available after July 31. 2nd by Ald. Woods and passed.

7. Discussion of Rotary Club sponsored horse show postponed again due to absence of Ald. King.

8. Supt. Owens asked to have traffic study made at S. Wall & Peters St. to determine if traffic light is needed.


9. Ald. Lewis moved to amend Code Section 3-5 to read: There shall be attached to and made a part of above application a financial statement detailing amount of investment by applicant, amount and source of loans, if any, and collateral used to secure loan or loans, if any. This statement, and the information therein, will be treated confidentially and examined only by the Mayor and Aldermen and the Clerk of the City of Calhoun. 2nd by Ald. David and passed.

10. Mayor instructed City Clerk to attend workshop on merger of county services at Dinkler Plaza hotel in Atlanta on Aug. 7.
11. Mayor read letter from Red Cross Chapter Chairman Don Sanders stating that the Red Cross preferred to keep their office at its present location in the Civic Center. (Chamber of Commerce now shares this office with Red Cross and had asked to use all the office.) Council discussed and postponed helping C of C locate a suitable office.
12. Supt. Owens mentioned purchasing a roller to be used in conjunction with the new asphalt distributor purchased by the county. Council suggested he secure price quotations and put cost in the new budget.
13. Clerk heard in regard to letter from president of Cherokee Credit Insurance Co. of Macon asking waiver of penalties on business tax since he had not been billed for same by City. Council agreed to waive payment of penalties.
14. Clerk asked Council whether to refund business tax paid by Reliable Insurance & Realty or collect this tax from other insurance agencies. Council ruled Reliable's money should be refunded.
15. Council voted to update Electrical Code by adopting unanimously the 1962 National Electrical Code.
16. Mr. David made a motion to adjourn, 2nd by Mr. Woods and done.
