


APRIL 22, 1963 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR FRANK DICKINSON PRESIDING, ALDERMEN TOM B. DAVID, ARDEN J. KING, JOHN A. LEWIS, JR. AND J. T. WOODS, JR. PRESENT.

1. Mr. Bert Lance opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of April 8 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. King sought and received approval of City Council to send Police Chief Luther Roberts to the Seminar for Police Chiefs at the Center for Continuing Education at Athens. Chief Roberts to attend four day session and receive \$50.00 plus \$.06 per mile.
4. Ald. King made motion that Policewomen Davis and Ingle work parking meters at end of present school term and receive same rate of pay as now drawing for school crossing duty. Mrs. Davis and Mrs. Ingle to work alternate weeks or however is agreeable. This motion seconded by Ald. Woods and passed.
5. Ald. King heard regarding two-way traffic on one-way Sequoyah Terrace and asked strict enforcement from Police Dept.
6. Ald. David said Mr. L. Hamrick had asked for reduction in license of used car dealers, but Council insisted Mr. Hamrick pay \$50 as all other dealers.
7. Ald. David heard in regard to storm drainage ditch North and South of W. Court St. Council agreed standard procedure applied, i.e., property owners buy pipe and City will install it.
8. Ald. David said Mr. Fred Stephens had complained of inadequate water at the Rosser Motel. Supt. Owens said Mr. Stephens would need a larger tap and main on his property for an increase in the City's service to be of appreciable help.
9. Ald. David stated that Mr. C. H. Dellinger would sell the Cleve B. Smith house for \$6500. Council not interested.
10. Ald. David to attend meeting of Civil Defense Directors in Macon May 2 & 3 on approved motion of Ald. King with second from Ald. Lewis.
11. Ald. Lewis heard regarding inadequate curbs at Combs Funeral Home and residence of Fred Daves, Jr.
12. Ald. Lewis in matter of truck-trailer parking at Ojay Mills. Discussed but no action taken.
13. Ald. Woods and Ald. King expressed concern over water to Red Bud, and asked Supt. Owens to figure cost of this extension.
14. Mr. J. J. McBee's request that his house and lot at 196 Victory Drive be annexed by the City granted on motion of Ald. King, seconded by Ald. Woods.
15. Ald. Lewis and King, Supt. Owens and Clerk to attend 7th District GMA meeting May 2 at Rome's Holiday Inn.
16. Ald. King's motion that employees get same vacations as in the past was seconded by Ald. Lewis and passed.
17. Supt. Owens announced that Ralph Meadows had been employed in the Street Dept.
18. Supt. Owens said he felt the City needed a small trenching machine and Ald. King offered to get price on same.
19. Clerk said Mrs. J. B. (Edna) Langford had requested city to move large tree stump from her yard. Supt. Owens to get this done.
20. Clerk read letter from Dr. John Venable, Director of the State Department of Public Health. (Attached)
21. Ald. Woods moved that City trade property with Mr. C. L. Moss, seconded by Ald. Lewis and passed. Property involved is near Water Filtration Plant and City gains some 50 sq. ft. in swap as well as being in better position for future expansion.
22. Ald. Lewis made motion that all junk yards (scrap piles, auto graveyards, etc.) be required to enclose property occupied with an 8 ft. fence built of dressed lumber and painted. Mr. Lewis' motion also instructed Clerk to give owners 90 days notice in which to complete this construction. Ald. King seconded the motion and it was passed without a dissenting vote.
23. Clerk told Council that Mr. Winfred Martin felt that he should not be required to make \$6.00 deposit for water meter since he thought he made one in '52 when required amount was only \$2.50. Council instructed Clerk to collect \$6.00 deposit from Mr. Martin.
24. Motion to adjourn by Ald. David, Seconded by Ald. Woods & done.
