

JAN. 28, 1963 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR FRANK M. DICKINSON, ALDERMEN TOM B. DAVID, JOHN A. LEWIS, JR., AND J. T. WOODS, JR. PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of Jan. 14 meeting read and approved.
3. City Attorney and City Clerk reported on Fifth Annual Mayors' Day program and announced that Gordon Co. representative Troy S. Causby had introduced the bill which will give the City a new charter.
4. County School Supt. Wayne L. Ashworth told council of plans to build a maintenance shop for the county board's busses and asked to be allowed to build on south side of old armory. Since the armory has not yet been deeded back to the city, Ald. David suggested Mr. Ashworth consider building a garage on city property north of Pine St. and west of Fair St. Supt. Owens and Mr. Ashworth to visit proposed site together and determine if suitable.
5. Ald. Lewis said he had been asked by Mrs. C. C. Erwin to call council's attention to her claim for \$16.00 for having sewer un-stopped. Supt. Owens said stoppage was in service line of Mrs. Erwin and not in city main and council refused to pay claim.
6. Ald. Lewis said sidewalk from bank (drive in) north to residence of H. J. Combs needed replacing. Other areas in need of repair discussed and whether property owners should participate in cost of replacement, but no action taken.
7. Ald. Lewis asked Supt. Owens if he planned to replace sidewalk at Calhoun Gordon County Library. Mr. Owens said the walk will be replaced as soon as practicable.
8. Ald. Lewis said Mrs. Frank Miller had complained of water standing in front of her house on Second Ave. and suggested ditching to prevent this. Supt. Owens said the only solution would be to curb and gutter in front of her house.
9. Ald. David expressed concern over future of park since the state is considering selling the ^{W & A} ~~W & A~~ railroad. Clerk to secure names of members of study commission appointed by Gov. Sanders.
10. Supt. Owens told council that a new water & sewerage certificate issue in the amount of \$250,000.00 was needed to finance expansion of water system.
11. Supt. Owens in reply to council's request that he study finan-


cial condition of city so that employees might be given pay increase suggested that hourly employees be given 5¢ per hour and salaried employees get \$10.00 per month. Ald. David made motion that this be done, seconded by Ald. Woods and after lengthy discussion, Mr. David's motion was unanimously passed with raise to be effective with first pay period of '63 (Jan. 5).

12. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
