

FEB. 25, 1963 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR FRANK M. DICKINSON, ALDERMEN TOM B. DAVID, ARDEN J. KING, JOHN A. LEWIS, JR., AND J. T. WOODS, JR. PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of regular meeting of Feb. 11 read and approved.
3. Mr. Lex Jolley, vice president of Robinson-Humphrey Co. of Atlanta was present and advised council that the \$250,000.00 in water and sewerage certificates could be financed at 3½% (three and one-half percent) interest and that his company would pay legal fees, cost of printing, and accumulated interest. Ald. David made motion that City issue certificates and let Mr. Jolley's company handle same, second by Ald. King, voted on and passed.
4. Mr. James Boyd, Executive Director of the Housing Authority of the City of Calhoun informed council that his office had received preliminary loan contract from the PHA for 48 units, 24 for elderly whites and 24 for non-whites. Ald. Lewis moved that City Attorney J. C. Maddox draft resolution authorizing local housing authority to proceed with plans and enter into contract with PHA providing the 48 proposed units do not change existing contract local authority now has with PHA governing present housing units. Seconded by Ald. David and approved by council.
5. Ald. King requested city give \$75.00 to Recreation Commission for purchase of twelve (12) folding tables for Civic Center. Council agreed to do this.
6. Ald. King said he'd received complaints of dog packs destroying shrubbery and becoming a general nuisance and asked that notices be published in the Gordon County News and Calhoun Times warning dog owners to confine their dogs from March 6 to March 13. Police instructed to pick up and destroy all dogs during this week and those without inoculation tags thereafter.
7. Ald. King asked Supt. Owens to get three bids on police car and present at next regular meeting.
8. Ald. David heard regarding House Bills 85, 86, & 87, they being of vital concern to Georgia municipalities. Delegation to attend public hearings at State Capitol on Wed., Feb. 27.
9. Ald. David expressed discontent with parking situation on Piedmont St. between Hicks and S. Courtz Sts. Discussed but no definite action taken.
10. Ald. Lewis reminded council of local National Guard unit's request for \$1,000.00 to pay half the cost of steel lockers needed in new armory. Ald. David made motion city give \$1,000 provided the county give like amount, seconded by Ald. Woods and unanimously passed.
11. Ald. Lewis said he felt the city should replace all sidewalks in the city that are in need of replacement at no cost to property owners since they had paid their share of cost when original sidewalks were put down. Discussed, but no vote taken.
12. Application of Mr. Clarence E. Harris for malt beverage license for Gordon Hills Shopping Center location read.
13. Ald. King moved that the Malt Beverage Ordinance be amended to permit residents of Gordon County to be eligible for license. Seconded by Ald. Woods, voted on and passed.
14. Gasoline storage tanks, their size and location, were discussed and Ald. Lewis moved that a new ordinance regulating them be drafted by city attorney, Ald. David seconded this motion and it carried without a dissenting vote.
15. Ald. King moved the adoption of an ordinance accepting the Gordon Hills Shopping Center into the city as of Feb. 15. Ald. Woods seconded and it passed unanimously.
16. Supt. Owens told council that a new dump truck was needed by the Street Dept. and that this expenditure was included in the budget. Council instructed Mr. Owens to secure 3 bids on cab and chassis for submission at next meeting.
17. Supt. Owens advised council that there was still some confusion regarding burials in Fain Cemetery. He and Ald. Woods to discuss with local undertakers and report later.
18. Ald. David moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. King and done.
