


MARCH 25, 1963 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR FRANK M. DICKINSON, ALDERMEN JERRY KING, JOHN A. LEWIS, JR. AND J. T. WOODS, JR. PRESENT. ALD. DAVID ATTENDING JUNIOR COLLEGE MEETING AT HIGH SCHOOL BLDG.

1. Mayor Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of regular meeting of March 11 read and approved; minutes of special meeting of March 12 were rejected.
3. An ordinance (see opposite page of minute book) was passed adopting the Code of Ordinances as prepared by Municipal Code Corp. of Tallahassee, Florida.
4. By action of Council Sections 7-16 and 7-17 of the Code of Ordinances were repealed.
5. Clerk read letter from Mr. Marvin L. Taylor, Administrator of Gordon County Hospital, requesting the City to furnish the hospital with free water. Request denied.
6. Letter from Dr. John H. Venable, Director of the State Dept. of Public Health read and discussed. Dr. Venable's letter informed Council that immediate steps should be taken towards abatement of stream pollution. Council asked Supt. Owens to request Mr. Bill Greene of Wiedeman & Singleton, the City's consulting engineers, to attend meeting of April 8, to discuss sewage problems with the City Council.
7. Ald. Lewis asked Supt. Owens to have all ditches cleaned and Mr. Owens said city prisoners would clean all week.
8. Ald. Lewis said he would like to see the parking lot on Park Avenue marked off and the sidewalk from this lot to the library replaced. Mr. Owens to have this done as soon as possible.
9. (Ald. David now present.) Ald. Lewis offered a motion to require an 8' board fence around North, East, and West sides of the junk yard on W. Line St. operated by Mr. H. E. Dickson. After discussion, Mr. David asked Mr. Lewis to withdraw his motion until April 8 meeting. Mr. Lewis agreed to do this.
10. Ald. Lewis asked that a letter of commendation be written Rep. Troy S. Causby for his opposition to the bill splitting the Cherokee Judicial Circuit. OK'd by Council.
11. Ald. David moved that W. Line St. be yellow-curbed for 50' from intersection of River St. and also from intersection of King St., 2nd by Ald. Woods and passed.
12. Bids opened on City's '53 GMC truck sold on whole is, as is basis, Richards Motors bid \$75.00, Claude Allen bid \$110.51, J. M. Hunt bid \$206.60. Ald. Lewis moved the truck be sold to Mr. Hunt, 2nd by Ald. King and done.
13. Supt. Owens announced that Mr. A. B. Walraven had been hired and assigned to the Electric Dept.
14. Supt. Owens notified Council that after Nov. 1, '63 the Federal Communications Commission would permit no business on the frequency city is now on except police. Council authorized Mr. Owens to purchase a new base station and an additional transistor radio to comply with the new regulations.
15. Clerk told council that Mrs. Ollie Serrit Sutherland had requested the City to extend water main to her property on the Old Fairmount Road. Supt. Owens stated that this was not feasible and no action was taken.
16. Ald. King made motion to adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Ald. David and done.
