

MAY 13 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL MAYOR FRANK M. DICKINSON, ALDERMEN TOM B. DAVID, JOHN A. LEWIS, JR., J.T. WOODS, JR. PRESENT ALDERMAN ARDEN J. KING ABSENT, UNTIL ITEM 14.

1. Mayor Dickinson opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of April 22 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. Woods said he felt it was time to open the new portion of Fain Cemetery and asked Supt. Owens to proceed with this as soon as possible.
4. Ald. Lewis inquired when the sidewalk in front of J. H. Harwell's residence on College St. would be re-paved. Supt Owens replied **it** was in the works.
5. Letter from City School Supt. G. V. Cate read and discussed. Mr. Cate anticipates a shortage of some \$2,000 in the budget due to several unforeseeable factors. (Letter attached.)
6. Supt. Owens announced the purchase of a back hoe from King Ford Tractor at a cost of \$2100.
7. Supt. Owens told Council that Charles Allen and Dean Harris had been employed in the Street Dept.
8. Bids on standpipe at Resaca to be opened at 2 P. M. Wed, May 22.
9. Supt. Owens said there were rumors that Trend Mills might locate a large laundry in Plainville and advised Council that present water main would be inadequate in the event these reports materialize. Council said City would increase water main size or do whatever was necessary to adequately supply their needs.
10. Ald. Lewis said he would like to see Elm St. widened and resurfaced and Piedmont St. widened between S. Court & Hicks. If these projects cannot be financed in this year's budget, then by all means they should be included in next year's budget.
11. Letter from Dept. of Health read and attached to minutes.
12. Supt. Owens told Council that the present City Garage was not large enough and that plans to enlarge it encompassing old electric building should be considered.
13. Ald. Lewis reported briefly on the recent 8th District GMA meeting in Rome.
14. Ald. King asked Police Chief Roberts for stricter enforcement of one way Sequoyah Terrace to eliminate two-way traffic.
15. By unanimous action, Council declared Metter Lane to be one way east when ordinance is drawn and street is properly marked.
16. Motion by Ald. David to adjourn, Seconded by Ald. Woods and so ordered by Mayor Dickinson.
