


JULY 26, 1965 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR FRANK M. DICKINSON, ALDERMEN TOM B. DAVID, ARDEN J. KING, W. R. NORTON AND J. T. WOODS, JR. PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer.
2. Minutes of July 12 meeting read and approved.
3. Earl C. Reeves, Jr. appeared before council to appeal a sentence of the Recorder's Court in which he was fined \$505 or 90 days in jail. Mrs. Barbara Pierce said Reeves was creating a disturbance and she signed a warrant for his arrest. Reeves told the council his version of the incident, then Policeman Frank Bennett gave his account, which differed with Reeves' story on several points. The mayor and aldermen went into executive session briefly and announced that they were upholding the finding of City Recorder Eugene F. Edge. Mr. Reeves was unable to pay the fine and was remanded to jail.
4. Jimmy Gee appealed a fine of \$27 for speeding imposed on him on July 20. In answer to Ald. King's question as to the specific complaint, Mr. Gee admitted that he was not contesting the fine but, rather the conduct of Police Sgt. Claude E. Allen. He accused Sgt. Allen of talking "smart" to him and to a number of others whom he had arrested. The council heard the same charge from Lewis Couch. No action was taken.
5. Troy Causby and Frank Stephens requested council to furnish water to a service station on southwest corner of Red Bud Rd. and I-75. They said they could get by if water could be made available by this Fall and council agreed to supply water then.
6. Bill Strain, Coastal States Insurance Co. rep., sought and received council's permission to talk with city employees prior to work hours in an effort to sell accident insurance on a payroll deduction plan.
7. Ald. David heard in the matter of the Recreation Commission becoming a legal entity so that it might purchase some 35 A of land. Mr. David made a motion that the city attorney advise proper action for the commission to follow. Ald. Norton seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.
8. Sealed bids on a truck for the water department were opened and Ald. King moved that the low bid be accepted. (Prater Ford bid \$1949 and Roy Davis Chevy-Olds bid was \$1976.07) Ald. Norton seconded the motion which was voted on and passed.
9. Dispos-All Service, Inc. of Dalton, a garbage collection concern, made an offer of \$4282 per month to pick up garbage in the city, provided the city furnish a landfill dump. No action taken.
10. Supt. James Owens said Astro Dye Works had agreed to pay the cost of lowering the sanitary sewer at their plant.
11. Ald. King moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. David and done.
