


FEB. 22 REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT EXCEPT
ALD. J. T. WOODS, JR.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of Feb. 8 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. David had clerk read letter from County Commissioner Everett L. DeFoor to Congressman John W. Davis seeking the aid of the congressman in securing a federal building for Calhoun for federal offices and post office. Mr. David suggested the city also write Mr. Davis.
4. Letter from J. D. Anderson, dba as Anderson's Food Center, read (attached to minutes) and copy to be mailed State Highway Dept. with a request that Mr. Anderson be given any available information concerning city section on Oothcaloga St.
5. Ald. David said the county has effected considerable savings on gasoline by installing a large underground tank. Supt. Owens to handle.
6. Ald. David said the Civil Defense Dept. would conduct a shelter management course in the bank building on March 21, 22 and 23 from 8 to 4:30. Council agreed to furnish up to \$50 for purchase of food.
7. Ald. David heard in regard to enlarging the apron on one side of the Negro swimming pool and erecting a fence around the pool. Council agrees this is to be done.
8. Ald. David said some interested parties had contacted him in an effort to have the Negro baseball field lighted. Supt. Owens to get estimate of cost.
9. Ald. David told council that Comm. DeFoor was still trying to get radios on city's frequency. Mayor Dickinson referred the matter to Ald. King.
10. Supt. Owens reported that the new Negro swimming pool had been filled. (He did not say if it held water.)
11. Mr. Howard Ralston's request to have city erect banner over Wall St. in commemoration of National Life Insurance Week was denied by council.
12. Supt. Owens advised that the '53 Chevrolet pick-up attracted only four bids and Donald Bearden had purchased it for \$165.00.
13. Council announced that any individual or group wishing to use the civic center would have to pay a fee of \$10.00.
14. Ald. Norton moved to adjourn, Ald. King seconded and the meeting was adjourned.
