

APRIL 26, 1965 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL  
PRESENT EXCEPT ALD. KING.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the April 12 meeting read and approved.
3. Mr. Calvin Caldwell, chairman of the sewer service charge committee, submitted industry's proposal which, although using different percentages, yielded practically the same monetary return as the city proposal. Council agreed to study the proposal and meet later for final adoption of a formula.
4. Mr. Dick Mustee of Cole-Layer-Trumble, Tax Appraisers, told council and County Commissioner Everett DeFoor and County Attorney J. C. Maddox that his firm could not complete a tax revaluation program for the city and county prior to December of 1966. Comm. Defoor and the council decided to ask a representative of another firm to appear before them in the near future.
5. Troy Causby, R. L. Collins and C. M. Hatton, gasoline distributors, objected to purchasing of petroleum products on a bid basis. Ald. Norton moved to continue present method of purchasing, seconded by Ald. Woods; voted and passed.
6. Alton McDaniel, representing Commercial Broadloom, asked council to assure his firm of adequate water supply for insurance underwriters' approved sprinkler system. Council agreed to do this.
7. Attorney Harbin M. King, representing Mrs. Ross Holland, reminded council of accident involving his client on Sept. 29, 1964 on Hunt Drive. Medical report of Dr. W. D. Hall indicates Mrs. Holland is suffering from a displaced kidney and back injuries allegedly caused from driving her car into a ditch left by city workmen when making a water tap on Hunt Drive. Mayor Dickinson advised Mr. King to contact city attorney T. L. Shanahan.
8. Frank Stephens asked council to extend water main to his proposed subdivision east of Barrett Road and also requested improvement of road from Dew's Pond Rd. into former site of city dump (still city property). Supt. Owens to investigate this.
9. Supt. Owens told council that he had been asked to ascertain if the Civic Center could be purchased. Council decided against entertaining any proposals for disposal of this property.
10. Council agreed to purchase a Chevelle automobile to replace the pickup truck recently wrecked. Roy Davis Chevy-Olds submitted the low bid.
11. Improved lighting system for the football field was discussed.
12. Clerk announced that the Georgia Municipal Assn. convention would be held on Jekyll Island, June 20, 21 and 22.
13. Ald. David moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. Woods and done.
