

NOVEMBER 8, 1965 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL - ALD, KING ABSENT

1. Minutes of October 25 meeting read and approved.
2. Boyd Cochran, representing Cochran Bros., and L. C. Barnett, representing H & H House Movers, told Council the width and height restrictions should be removed from the ordinance and a permit costing \$25 should be charged on each building and house moved. Council agreed to this and also required liability insurance and payment of all damages by the house movers.
3. George Avery presented a petition signed by residents of the Parker Subdivision requesting the City to install a larger water main to give them adequate water volume.
4. Bids were opened on a 2-ton truck (cab and chassis) with Prater Ford at \$2645.00 and Roy Davis \$2590.84. Ald. Norton moved to accept the low bid and purchase the Chevrolet. Ald. David seconded the motion which was voted and passed.
5. Ald. Norton said the Christmas decorations would be installed and turned on Thanksgiving Day.
6. Fire Chief Hyde announced that H. T. "Tommy" Jones had replaced Hugh Dell West in the Fire Dept.
7. Ald. David moved to enter into a contract with Williams, Sweitzer and Barnum of Rome for topographic and property surveys, subsurface investigation, soil classification and resident inspection on the Tom B. David Field. Ald. Norton seconded, voted and passed.
8. Council accepted property of J. J. McBee on Victory Drive and Billy Cochran on N. Wall St. into the city on petition of owners. Ald. Woods motion, Ald. David's second.
9. Ald. Norton moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. Woods and done.
