

DEC. 13, 1965 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of Nov. 22 meeting read and approved.
3. Council ordered the City Hall closed from noon Sat., Dec. 24 to 8 AM Tues., Dec. 27 for Christmas holidays.
4. Mrs. Jack D. Campbell, of a W. Belmont Dr. address, complained that the contractor grading this street had disrupted their water service several times and the last occasion caused damage to her washing machine in the amount of \$35.55. Mrs. Campbell told council that her car was damaged in the amount of \$10.50, caused by the caving in of the water main ditch across the driveway. She said she was willing to forget the car damage, but expected pay for her washer. Clerk to write Caldwell Const.
5. H. C. Tant, Pres. of TCA Tower Co. of Mableton, asked council for franchise to install cable TV. Clerk to notify Mr. Tant of council's decision.
6. James & Lily Fletcher said the garbage men picked up some of their utensils and dishes by mistake. Council advised that their loss would be replaced insofar as practical.
7. Ald. Norton heard in regard to Robert Acree's house on River St. Clerk to notify Mr. Acree that this house must be repaired so as to meet minimum building code standards or it must be removed from the city or torn down.
8. Ald. David said the hole in the sidewalk on Court St. at Pate's Store should be filled.
9. Supt. Owens reported on the GMA Power Section meeting held recently at the Americana in Atlanta. Mr. Owens said the FPC trial examiner had ruled in favor of the cities. Mr. Owens explained a proposed mutual aid pact for cities during an emergency. The council approved.
10. Supt. Owens proposed an all-electric rate for commercial users. Ald. Woods made a motion that the rate remain the same for the first 250 KW, then 1¢ per KW for all over 250 KW. Ald. Norton seconded and the motion passed.
11. Supt. Owens heard in regard to a new type garbage pickup. Council asked Mr. Owens and Ald. Norton to study the proposal and make their recommendations to the council.
12. Ald. David told council that some additional land would be required for the airport and moved that the city pay \$250 as its share for this land. Ald. King seconded and the motion was voted on and passed.
13. Ald. Norton suggested that a list of the qualified city voters be published during the month of January. Council approved.
14. Clerk reported results of City Election of Dec. 8, as follows:  
For Mayor, Frank M. Dickinson - 325 votes, for aldermen, Arden J. "Jerry" King - 264 votes, W. R. "Billy" Norton - 251 votes, E. C. Pate - 122 votes; for board of education, Bill D. Mathews - 330 votes, J. D. Meadows, Jr. - 324 votes. Council accepted.
15. Council discussed the zoning ordinance, but no action taken.
16. Ald. Norton moved to adjourn, Ald. King seconded and the meeting was adjourned.
