

JUNE 14, 1965 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY-COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT
EXCEPT ALD. J. T. WOODS, JR.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer.
2. Minutes of the May 24 meeting read and approved.
3. Attorney John D. Edge said he represented John Henry Chattam and he thought the city was preventing his client from collecting fire insurance on a house that burned on West Line St. Mayor Dickinson told Mr. Edge that the house belonged to the city at the time it burned, but the city had nothing to do with the withholding of any claim settlement. The mayor said he would write Interstate Fire Insurance Co. advising them the city's position in the matter.
4. Ald. David made a motion to build a wading pool at the Negro swimming pool, cost not to exceed \$200. Ald. Norton seconded the motion. The motion was voted on and passed.
5. Ald. David said he had received complaints that the water volume and pressure on S. Wall St. was inadequate.
6. Ald. King reported that he had investigated a complaint on loud music and bathers changing clothes outdoors at the Negro swimming pool. Mr. King said the recreation commission would handle this.
7. Supt. Owens advised that Mr. Raymond Bagwell had purchased the Martha King house from the city on a high bid of \$256.26.
8. Supt. Owens said it would cost \$1,070.00 to install storm sewer on E. Line St. at Mr. Tom David's property. The council agreed to share the cost equally with Mr. David since he had given the city an easement for a sidewalk in the same location.
9. Supt. Owens reported that the water standpipe at Plainville was leaking, but would be repaired soon.
10. Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell thanked the council for permitting him to attend an electric meter school in Wilmington, N. C.
11. The council was shown several photos of several sub-standard houses in the city.
12. Council accepted the audit performed by Mr. R. M. Dobbs, CPA covering the period from August 1 thru Dec. 31, 1965.
13. Ald. King moved to adjourn, Ald. David seconded and the meeting was declared adjourned by Mayor Dickinson.
