


APRIL 12, 1965 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL
MEMBERS PRESENT EXCEPT ALD. W. R. NORTON

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of March 22 meeting read and approved.
3. Mrs. Pearl Shanahan informed council that the Calhoun-Gordon county library was short of funds and asked for an increase in the city's appropriation. Ald. David moved that the city increase its payments from \$350 quarterly to \$500, Ald. King seconded the motion which passed unanimously.
4. Calvin Caldwell, chairman of the committee appointed by Mayor Dickinson to study the proposed sewage service charge, asked the council to delay action until the April 26 meeting. Council agreed.
5. Bill Barlowe, dba Barlowe Service Station at Hicks & S. Wall, complained to council of cars turning thru his driveway instead of the intersection. Mr. Barlowe also complained about water standing along the edge of the sidewalk. Council told Mr. Barlowe the police would be instructed to keep a close surveillance on his place.
6. Billy Hughey was asked to attend this meeting and enlighten council as to the type machines he was operating in "Billy's Arcade" on S. Wall St. Mr. Hughey convinced council that he had no illegal machines and promised to get parents' permission for minors to patronize his place.
7. Ald. King, chairman of the police committee, announced that Frank Bennett had replaced Truman Henley and Jimmy Cochran had taken Charles Ellis' position on the police force.
8. David Lynch asked council to repeal the zoning ordinance passed at the March 22 meeting in order that he might sell his property for an apartment house to be built in the zoned area. Council declined to repeal the ordinance.
9. Mr. Lynch then asked council to stop speeding on Cherry Hill Drive. Police to enforce traffic ordinances more rigidly.
10. Council received a complaint that Mr. Vern Kuhlman's swimming pool was not completely enclosed by fence. Mayor Dickinson told clerk to inform Mr. Kuhlman that he would have to comply with the law and fence his pool.
11. Council refused to grant franchise for community antenna TV.
12. It was announced that the City Supt., Inspector and Clerk would attend the Codes Workshop April 20 at the Coosa CC in Rome.
13. Ald. King moved to buy Scotsman Ice Maker for \$1245. Ald. Woods seconded and the motion carried.
14. Supt. Owen's reported that the pickup truck driven by St. Supt. Slim Kirby had been badly damaged when struck by a car and should be traded. (The truck was parked on Line St. and unoccupied at the time of the accident.)
15. Ald. David made a motion to adjourn. Ald. Woods seconded and the meeting was adjourned.
