

APRIL 28, 1969-REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL, ALL PRESENT.

1. In the absence of Chaplain T. J. Lance, Frank L. Hutchinson gave the invocation.
2. Minutes of the April 14 meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor Dickinson opened bids on \$1,250,000 Water & Sewerage Revenue Bonds:
John Nuveen & Co, Dominick & Dominick, Inc. - 5.93495 %
Kidder, Peabody & Co, Inc & Associates - 5.994086%
White, Weld & CO - 6.1271 %
Johnson, Lane, Space, Smith & Co & Assoc. - 5.868139%
Lex Jolley, acting as the city's fiscal agent, said the apparent low bidder was Johnson, Lane, Space, Smith & Co. and Associates, but he would check the bids. After this was done, Mr. Jolley advised that Johnson, Lane, Space, Smith & Co. and Associates were the low bidders; whereupon Ald. David moved to accept the low bid. This was seconded by Ald. Holland, voted on and passed. Alderman Holland then moved the passage of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$1,250,000 City of Calhoun Water & Sewerage Revenue Bonds and to waive the reading of said ordinance since Council is familiar with same. Ald. David 2nd, voted on and passed.
4. E. Frank Walraven, Jr., Paul McEntire and Mark Whittemore expressed their interest in an annexation referendum for their area south of the present city limits. Council offered their cooperation.
5. Ald. David said he would like it to be a matter of record that the Recreation Commission would one day expect to use the area now operated by the city as a sanitary landfill.
6. Supt. Owens announced that the Northwest Georgia Regional Health Advisory Council would divide \$20,400 equally between the city and the County for use in the operation of sanitary landfills. Mr. Owens said a small building would be required by the NGRHAC.
7. Ald. Holland moved that occupants of business houses with alleys in rear be mailed a notice requesting their cooperation in using the containers made available to them. 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
8. Roy Fox asked about the annexation of the former Jim Porter property and the former residence of M. C. Dobson, but Mayor Dickinson suggested that these petitions be temporarily held in abeyance.
9. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
