

NOV. 10, 1969 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the regular meeting of Oct. 27 and the called meeting of Oct. 29 read and approved.
3. City Supt. of Schools Gus Cate and four members of the Board of Education were present to discuss problems of mutual concern with the Council. Chairman R. L. Collins, Jr. requested the city to install security lights around the school buildings to deter potential burglars. J. B. Langford stated that he could not see why the City cannot have the schools' money available on the first day of each quarter. Jimmy Tamplin asked the City to clean the lot at East Side Elementary and Supt. Cate interjected that he had already discussed this with City Supt. James Owens.
4. Drs. Purcell, Rabb and Thompson heard in the matter of closing a portion of Pine St. Dr. Purcell maintained that the City had agreed through Supt. Owens to relocate the street prior to the closing of the existing street. Mayor Dickinson suggested that Ald. Holland, Street Committee Chairman, investigate and recommend a course of action.
5. Supt. Owens said he had advised Mr. J. C. Boyd, Executive Dir. of the Housing Authority, that the City might waive the costs of building permits and plumbing and electric permits on the new units. This was made official on motion of Ald. Woods, 2nd of Ald. David.
6. Supt. Owens announced that J. & R. Smith had submitted the low bid for extension of the sanitary sewer main to the property of Stuckey's on the east side of I-75 and Red Bud Road. Mr. Jim Andrews, representing Stuckey's, said his company would put up 3/4 of the \$10,739, use city water and request annexation of their property provided the city will extend the sewer main and return 2/3 of the money when, and if, Standard Oil and Slagle Moss develop their property. Ald. Woods moved to accept this proposal, seconded by Ald. David and approved.
7. Ald. Woods said that Georgia Power should be contacted and requested to submit purchase price of their property on Devonwood Drive.
8. Ald. Woods stated that the city needed a leash law or some other method of controlling dogs.
9. Ald. David said he had been asked to consider a change in the subdivision ordinances requiring developers to include an area to be used for a park.
10. Ald. Cox said that the tree on the northwest corner of the intersection of Barrett Road and Hunt Drive created a blind spot for motorists and should be cut.
11. Supt. Owens reported that some industrial plants are using unmetered water through fire hydrants and their sprinkler systems. Ald. Woods, Water & light chairman, and Mr. Owens to investigate.
12. Resolution authorizing Mayor Dickinson to execute contract "B" of the sewer system improvements adopted following motion of Ald. Woods, 2nd by Ald. Holland.
13. Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell asked if he was now to make water taps outside the city limits without a permit from the Gordon County Health Dept. Mayor Dickinson advised that he is.
14. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
