


SEPT. 8, 1969-REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance read the 35th Psalm and opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of the August 25th meeting were read and approved.
3. John Slagle's application for a package malt beverage license at US 41 and SR 53 postponed until the Sept. 22 meeting.
4. Ald. Cox suggested a garbage collection monthly service charge as a means of increasing revenues. This was discussed but no action taken. Ald. Woods then moved that the property tax remain the same as in 1968, 18 mills. Ald. David seconded the motion and it was passed.
5. Ald. David heard in the matter of a "high pressure" water main for the South Industrial Park. Supt. Owens said that the insurance companies were continually changing their requirements and the expense involved in complying with them can be excessive. Mr. Owens said a meeting with representatives of FIA and Factory Mutual (insurance companies) was scheduled for 10 AM, Monday, September 15th.
6. Ald. David said Forrest Holsomback, Cherry Hill Drive, had complained of surface water running into his yard. After discussion, it was decided there was little the city could do since the lot of Mr. Holsomback is on the low side of the street.
7. Gordon County School Supt. Wayne L. Ashworth and Principal Sam Rutherford, of the Sugar Valley School, were present to request an increase in the supply of water to the school. Supt. Ashworth stated that the supply was insufficient to operate the flush valves. After discussing costs and solutions, it was suggested that a pressure tank be installed.
8. The Louise Avenue property of Charles B. King was annexed by petition on motion of Ald. Holland, 2nd by Ald. David.
9. Supt. Owens reported that he had acquired three bids on a maintenance building 50' x 48' x 16' to be erected on the property purchased from Elnora Harper. Mr. Owens said that most of the cost of the structure would be recovered through the Northwest Georgia Regional Health Advisory Council. The bids were: Raymond King Co. - \$8,992.00; Garner Bros. Co. - \$8,440.00 and Bill Franklin Construction Co. - \$8,469.54. Ald. David moved to accept the low (Garner Bros.) bid, 2nd by Ald. Holland, voted on and passed.
10. Ald. Woods moved to adjourn; Ald. David seconded and Mayor Dickinson declared the meeting adjourned.
