

NOV. 24, 1969 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with the reading of the Eighth Psalm, followed by the evening prayer.
2. Minutes of the Nov. 10 meeting were read and approved.
3. Mrs. Walter Tinsley and Paul Schwab requested council to donate \$2,000.00 to match the county's contribution as part of the \$10 to \$12,000.00 of local money needed to open a school for the mentally retarded. Mayor Dickinson asked that they await a decision until the Dec. 8 meeting.
4. Ald. Cox said Mrs. John W. Parris had requested a street light be installed in front of her residence at Oothcaloga and River.
5. Ald. Holland advised that he would personally contact all the individuals concerned with the relocation of Pine St.
6. Ald. Holland heard in regard to proposed taxing of vending machines, but no conclusion was reached.
7. Ald. David reported that Wayne Kuhlman and Forrest Holsomback were interested in having curb and gutter installed along their property on Cherry Hill Drive. Supt. Owens to determine cost.
8. Supt. Owens announced that work had commenced on the addition to the water plant.
9. Clerk read copy of letter from City Attorney Tom Shanahan to Starr-Mathews Agency re the accident involving a city police car and Moore Builders' truck driven by Adam Seabolt.
10. Clerk read letter from Kayo Oil co. seeking reduced electric rates for 24 hour businesses. Council advised that no special rates would be instituted for businesses operated at night.
11. Ald. Holland moved to adjourn; 2nd by Ald. David and done.
