

OCT. 27, 1969 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS
PRESENT. ~~EXCEPT XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the the Oct. 13 meeting were read and adopted.
3. Mayor Dickinson reported a noticeable decline in the number of police calls to the "West Side" since the closing of the malt beverage outlet known as "Charlie's Run-A-Round".
4. Ald. Holland reported that his committee to revise the Business and Occupation Tax Ordinance recommended a minimum license of \$25.00, an increase in several specific categories (noted in the schedule), requiring life insurance companies to pay 1% of gross premium revenue and assessing owners of vending machines, except 1¢ gum, weighing, etc., either \$2 or \$5 per machine annually. Council did not agree on the vending machine levy and decided to settle the issue at the Nov. 10 meeting.
5. Ald. Woods said the old water plant looked better since the weeds had been cut. Supt. Owens advised that the fence would be re-erected at the new water filtration plant. Mr. Woods asked that the public be notified not to burn leaves nor litter the streets when transporting garbage to the dump.
6. Supt. Owens heard in the matter of police cars not running smoothly on certain gasoline. Council decided that police vehicles could purchase the type gasoline they claimed to get the best service from.
7. Supt. Owens reported that Astro Dye, Crown Crafts and Drs. Purcell and Thompson were at odds over whether to close Pine St. Council said this would be resolved at the Nov. 10 meeting.
8. Supt. Owens said he had been contacted by Mr. E. C. Pate who wished to build an addition to his house to make several apartments. This matter referred to planning commission.
9. Supt. Owens said that G. C. Dooley had asked if the First Methodist Church might purchase a 3-yd. garbage container at less than the city's cost of \$250.00. Council said no.
10. Supt. Owens re Aldon Area Rugs building addition which will be in conflict with existing city water mains. Mr. Owens suggested that portion of the main in conflict with construction be given to Aldon with the city moving some 800 ft. back and metering with one 8" meter instead of the 3-3/4 and 1-6 inch now in use. Ald. Woods moved to accept this recommendation, 2nd by Ald. Cox, voted on and approved.

11. Supt. Owens announced that he had talked with "Zeke" Hufstetler about the Oothcaloga St. project and the highway department will not agree to changing their designed routing. Council advised that the state be notified to proceed as planned.
12. Clerk read letter from John Cunningham and John Slagle requesting sanitary sewer mains be extended to I-75 and SR-53. Supt. Owens to investigate and report.
13. Ald. Holland moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
