

April 14, 1969-REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Mayor Dickinson administered the oath of office to newly elected Alderman George W. Cox.
2. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
3. Minutes of the regular meeting of March 24 were read and approved.
4. James C. Boyd, Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals, said he had studied the zoning ordinances of several nearby cities and recommended the adoption of the accompanying ordinance. Ald. David moved to adopt, 2nd by Ald. Holland, voted on and passed.
5. Mrs. Edna Langford, Chairman of the Recreation Commission, advised the Council that the Charles M. Graves organization would furnish plans of the proposed outdoor facilities for \$2,600.00. Mrs. Langford stated that since the city had agreed to pay \$4,000.00 for architectural fees, the county had been requested to pay this fee, but Comm. DeFoor said the county would be unable to pay until January, 1970. The commissioner was quoted as promising to reimburse the city at this time, if the Council would provide the requested funds at this time. Ald. David moved that the city borrow \$2,600.00 to be given to the Recreation Comm. for the above stated purpose provided Gordon County's Comm. of Roads & Revenues, Everett L. DeFoor, agrees to reimburse the city the full amount of both principal and interest in January, 1970. 2nd by Ald. Woods, voted on and passed.
6. Bids were opened from Roy Davis Chevrolet-Olds, Prater Ford and Lee Suggs Chrysler-Plymouth on a truck (cab and chassis only) for the Sanitation Dept., two cars for the Police Dept. and one car for the City Supt. Roy Davis submitted the low bid on the truck, \$4,698.72, Prater Ford was low on all three cars, \$2,839.00 for the Supt. and \$2,774.00 each for the Police cars. Ald. David moved to accept the low bid on all vehicles, 2nd by Ald. Woods and approved.
7. Supt. Owens said the Harpers had agreed to accept \$45,000.00 for the 62 acres adjacent to the proposed site of the sewerage treatment plant, payable \$4,500.00 per annum at 5% interest. Ald. David moved that the offer be accepted, 2nd by Ald. Holland, voted on and passed.
8. Supt. Owens reported that the TD-15 'dozer being made available for sanitary landfill thru the NW Ga. Regional Health Advisory Council was inadequate for our dump and asked Council to approve the purchase of a TD-20, estimating the difference in cost at \$10,000.00. Ald. Holland made the motion to purchase the TD-20, 2nd by Ald. David, voted on and passed.
9. After discussing the extension of sanitary sewer service to Industrial Blvd. north of the city, Supt. Owens was instructed to contact Bill Greene of Wiedeman & Singleton and Lex Jolley to ascertain if the city can finance the installation of this main.
10. Ald. Holland received approval of his request that Wiedeman & Singleton prepare plans for future expansion of water and sewer facilities.
11. Ald. Woods suggested that an extension be added to the reservoir on Brogdon Mtn. to stop the waste of water.
12. Clerk read a thank you note from Pam Clark, widow of Ald. Jerry Clark.
13. Results of the run-off election published with George Cox defeating Kyle Smith, 297 votes to 276 votes.
14. Ald. Woods moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. David and done.
