


FEB. 10, 1969 - REGULAR MEETING CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT  
EXCEPT ALD. JERRY CLARK.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance introduced the Rev. T. Wayne Cain, pastor of the Echota Baptist Church, who delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of Jan. 27 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. Holland moved that the city proceed immediately to convert the Men's Park into a parking lot. 2nd by Ald. Woods, voted on and approved.
4. Letter read from Perfect Fit Industries, Inc, doing business locally as C & H Tufting, requesting that the city extend its sanitary sewer mains to their plant on Hood St. just west of the city limits. Letter read from R. S. Howard, Jr., Executive Secretary of the State Water Quality Control Board, with reference to the proposed sewage treatment plant. (Copy attached.) Supt. Owens said he and Bill Greene, of Wiedeman & Singleton, had an appointment to discuss this with Mr. Howard next week.
5. Supt. Owens said he had a petition signed by some 14 residents of the Red Bud Rd. requesting extension of a 6" water main to the Moose Club Rd. Mr. Owens stated that the minimums required would be slightly higher than the customary \$3 per mo. Ald. Woods made the motion to install this main, 2nd by Ald. David, voted on and passed.
6. Ald. Woods suggested that the 12" water main on River St. be connected with the smaller main on Park avenue to boost pressure.
7. Supt. Owens said Raymond King Construction Co. had offered to erect three hangars at the Tom B. David Airport for \$11,000. Action postponed pending receipt of other bids.
8. Ald. David requested Supt. Owens to estimate the cost of a sidewalk, curb and gutter and paving of W. Court St. Council discussed piping the open ditch that crossed Court St. near the Henry Trippe residence. Supt. Owens estimated the cost of this pipe at \$8,00 per foot. No action taken.
9. Rev. T. Wayne Cain requested that the Council take action to stop heavy trucks from using College Circle.
10. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
