

MAY 26, 1969 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of meeting of May 12 read and approved.
3. E. Frank Walraven, Jr. and Council discussed the proposed referendum for extension of the city limits and agreed on the boundary lines.
4. Kenneth Herron, representing Georgia Dye Corp., asked Council if his company could be given some relief on their power bill since the plant is closed. After discussion, Ald. Woods made a motion that Ga. Dye be billed for the next 3 months at the scheduled rate, then at \$50.00 per month. Ald. David seconded and the motion was voted on and passed.
5. John Slagle requested Council to annex the property formerly owned by Jim Porter and M. C. Dobson (petitions for annexation having been signed earlier this year). Mr. Slagle said the property owners would request no services from the city this year. Ald. David moved to accept the property, 2nd by Ald. Woods, voted on and approved.
6. Rev. & Mrs. Judson Hendricks, M/M James Harris, Sr. advised the Council that they were seeking to construct a new church on the site of the old one, but only have a 50 ft. lot in the southwest corner of Court and McConnell. (They had previously been informed by Bldg. Insp. Bruce Bowman that the zoning ordinance required a 30 ft. set back from the street.) Council offered the services of Roy Fox to assist in arriving at a satisfactory solution.
7. Ald. Holland inquired as to progress being made on the street through the recreation area. Supt. Owens said work on this street is progressing satisfactorily. Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell reported that his men would soon complete installation of the lights for the two baseball diamonds.
8. Ald. Woods announced that Co. Comm. Everett DeFoor assured him that the county would, in the future, notify the city prior to using water from any fire hydrant.
9. Ald. David stated that he could not recommend issuance of a malt beverage package license for James S. McClurd at a Red Bud Road address. Mr. David said his action was strictly because of the location, for he found no fault with Mr. McClurd. Mr. David moved that the application be denied, but, the motion failing to receive a second was declared no motion by Mayor Dickinson. The mayor then asked for a motion to issue the license, but none was offered. (Ald. Holland disqualified himself from this entire action with the explanation that as a part owner of the property, some might construe his participation in the proceedings as a conflict of interest.)
10. Bids on an additional police car were opened with Roy Davis Chevrolet-Olds quoting \$2,781.00 and Prater Ford - \$2,728.50. Alderman David made the motion to purchase from the low bidder, Prater Ford, 2nd by Ald. Cox and done.
11. Supt. Owens advised that the Cotton Producers Ass'n well was not satisfactory due to the hardness of the water and the presence of manganese. Council authorized Mr. Owens to proceed with the purchase of a site for a stand pipe in the area.
12. Supt. Owens announced that 3 mobile radio units had been ordered and the cost of a new base station to control all radio equipped vehicles is \$3,195.00.
13. Clerk read the application for a package malt beverage license for Jack C. Knight on S. Wall St.
14. Ald. Holland moved to adjourn, Ald. David 2nd and done.
