



JUNE 23, 1969 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of the June 9 meeting read and approved.
3. Roy Chattam requested Council to approve a concrete sidewalk on the east side of Neal St. along the property of the Friendship Baptist Church. Mayor Dickinson asked Ald. Holland, Supt. Owens and St. Supt. Kirby to look into this matter. Mr. Chattam then asked Council for a refund of \$25.00 he paid for a fire call to his property which he contends was inside the city at the time. No action on this.
4. G. V. Cate, Supt. of City Schools, stated that the Aug. 6 referendum could add 250 elementary age children to the system. Mr. Cate said it would not be possible to accomodate that many children during the '69-70 term. Supt. Cate then advised the Council that the schools needed an additional \$25,000.00 to balance the '69-69 budget and estimated the new budget at \$265,000.00. Council approved on motion of Ald. David, 2nd of Ald. Holland.

5. Ald. David heard in regard to sanitary sewerage for industry in the south end of the city. Supt. Owens advised that an engineering study would have to be made.
6. Ald. Holland announced that paving of the street to the new recreation area would begin June 24.
7. Milton Stewart told Council that he and other residents of Devonwood Drive would like to have city power. He was advised that this would be done soon.
8. Supt. Owens reported that the city is ready to advertise for bids on construction of a one million gallon water reservoir in Oothcaloga Hts. subdivision.
9. Supt. Owens advised that the #2 sub-station is loaded to capacity. Ald. Woods moved that the city contract with Southeastern Consulting Engineers to perform a study and map the present electrical system. Seconded by Ald. David, voted on and passed. Amount of the contract to be \$5,400.00.
10. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
