

1. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Burdette and the invocation was given by City Chaplin John Allen.
2. Minutes of the Aug. 30, Sept. 8, Sept. 15 meetings were read and approved.
3. Mayor Burdette welcomed Boy Scout Troop 139, and their leader W. W. Balliew.
4. Public Comments: Boulevard Heights residents, John D. Edge, Mrs. Thomas H. Smith and Ms. Mildred Boston presented the Council with a petition signed by all the residents except one, requesting curb and gutter for their street. The Council agreed to curb and gutter but only when the projects started were finished, and when the weather was permissible.
5. New Business: (a) Several bonding firms presented bonding agreements to the Council regarding the proposed G.O. Bond Referendum on Nov. 19, 1975. Those appearing personally were Mr. Ed Jared and Mr. Bob Mulcay of Jared, Mulcay & Co., Inc.; Mr. Ted Thomas of Thomson & McKinnon and Mr. Gordon Martin of Lex Jolley & Co. A proposal was mailed in from W. L. Knox & Co. The Mayor asked for a special called meeting for Saturday, Sept. 27 at 10:00 a.m. to discuss each agreement and reach a decision.
(b) Ald. Cox and Police Chief Macomber reported that John Bell's Beer Package Store had been placed on probation since Sept. 13, 1975 because of a reported beer sale to a minor. Minor identified one of Mr. Bell's employees as selling the beer. The Council requested that a through investigation be made into the incident by the Police Dept. and reported back to the Council. The Council delayed any voting on Mr. Bell's request for a liquor license until the applicant's present beer license probation investigation was complete, continuing till the Oct. 13, 1975, regular meeting.
(c) Action on Alton DeFoor's beer license request was tabled due to the delay of Mr. Bell's liquor license application.
(d) Ald. Padgett made a motion to approve water taps for Bessie Durham, 110 Azelia Drive; J. C. Jarrett, Woodland Terrace Drive; Milton Stewart, 2 taps on Parker Subdivision, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
(e) Asst. Manager Roy Fox reported that the Crestmont residents would like to pay the additional cost to have curb and gutter installed rather than storm sewers. The City would not be obligated any further. Motion by Ald. Padgett to change to curb and gutter provided additional cost is borne by property owners, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
(f) Airport Authority requested permission to run natural gas line from John Reese's new building to the airport at an estimated cost of \$250.00. Motion by Ald. Collins to approve the request 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.

(g) Asst. Manager Fox reported that the roof on the educational building at the First Baptist Church property was in very bad repair and needed immediate attention. The Council asked that bids be taken and submitted at the special meeting on Sept. 27.

(h) Manager Hoyt Edwards reminded the Council of the GMA meeting on the 30th at the Calhoun Elks Club at 2:30 p.m.

6. New Business: Bids for the new police cars were opened.

Prater Ford - \$4839.00 - Belair Custom 500 with police package

Roy Davis - \$4880.01 - Impala with police package

Ald. Collins made a motion to accept low bid of \$4839.00 from Prater Ford, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.

Bids for a pick-up truck for City Engineer Hobgood were opened

Prater Ford - \$4089.00 Roy Davis - \$3992.28

Ald. Lewis made a motion to accept low bid from Roy Davis of \$3,992.28, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.

Bids for water plant doors and windows were opened. King Glass Co. - \$1698.00; Hamilton Glass Co. of Dalton - \$1790.00. Ald. Cox made a motion to accept low bid of \$1698.00 from King Glass Co., 2nd by Ald. Collins and approved.

7. Motion by Ald. Padgett to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
