

1. Call to order by Mayor Burdette. Rev. John Allen of Belmont Baptist Church gave the invocation.
2. The minutes of the May 12, 1975, meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: Mayor Burdette stated that he had received quite a bit of mail and telephone calls requesting that the First Baptist Church building be saved for a City Auditorium. He asked the Council to be considering this proposal as he would ask for a vote on this before the scheduled demolition. Mayor Burdette also announced the following Aldermen Committee changes: Ald. Cox - Police, Fire and Special Licenses; Ald. Lewis - Streets, Sanitation and Cemetery; Ald. Collins - Recreation Parks, Airport and Civil Defense. Ald. Padgett's committees would remain at Water, Power and Sewer. Mayor Burdette brought up the Pizza Hut beer application and asked for the audience's discussion. Mr. Blake Putnam, Mr. Tommy McDearis, Mr. J. C. McDearis, Mr. Steve Edwards and Rev. John Allen asked the Council members to consider this application carefully and give a negative vote. Mr. Steve Sosebee of Pizza Hut stated the reasons they normally apply, but after further discussion stated that he would withdraw the application at this time. He further stated that they would reapply in three or four months if they failed to get expected business quota. Mayor Burdette asked for a report on the Lovinggood sewer line. Hoyt Edwards and Roy Fox stated that a compromise had been reached and the line would be installed from the north end of the property. Easements and materials are being readied. L.M. Lovinggood has deposited \$4,000.00 with the City Clerk for the line. Motion by Ald. Collins to officially approve this action, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and passed. Mayor Burdette stated that a City and County sponsored school for plumbers interested in passing the State Plumbers test is in the planning stages. The cost to the City would be approximately \$400.00. The school would be taught by Mr. Royce Smith of DeKalb County. Motion to finalize the plans by Ald. Cox, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
4. Aldermen's Comments: Ald. Collins stated that he had met with the developers and residents of Crestmont Subdivision. The plan discussed was one using sloping ditches and storm sewers and would cost approximately \$5929.99 plus the grassing expense. The developers have agreed to pay \$2200.00 and the residents \$1800.00. After discussion by the Council, Ald. Collins made the motion for the City to install the pipe and pay the remaining cost. It is understood that the developer's and residents' money be on deposit with the Clerk before any work is begun. 2nd by Ald. Padgett. Ald. Lewis and Ald. Cox voted negative and the Mayor cast the deciding vote to pass the action.

5. Old Business: (a) A motion was made by Ald. Lewis to waive the 2nd reading of the "Rules of the Road" Ordinance and pass as read May 12, 1975, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
- (b) Ald. Padgett made the motion to grant water taps to Mr. R.T. Blaylock on the Moose Club Road and Mr. John Blair at Sugar Valley, 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved.
- (c) Mayor Burdette asked Roy Fox to get up to date cost on the drain ditches by the Housing Project, breaking these into sections, for the next Council meeting.
- (d) Ald. Lewis explained that the Wm. Holbert beer application could not be approved since the property owner had an interest in a liquor establishment. Such ownership is prohibited by the present liquor ordinance.
- (e) Mayor Burdette asked the City Clerk to inquire about the annual premiums for liability insurance for Councilmen.
6. New Business: (a) Ald. Lewis made the motion for the City to send a letter of confirmation regarding the Electrical Authority participation provided that the City's G.O. Bonding power is not affected, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
- (b) A priority list was made for the proposed Entitlement 6 General Revenue Sharing Funds. (1) Bulldozer & landfill operation (2) Capital improvement for Fire Dept. (3) Paving, curbing & guttering of existing city streets as approved in 1975 capital additions budget. (4) Storm sewers (5) Possible purchase of post office building.
- (c) The Clerk explained the possible revenue from the recently passed Hotel-Motel Tax law. The Clerk suggested that Motel owners be invited to attend the next council meeting if this questions was to be discussed. The Mayor authorized the subject to be placed on the next agenda and the interested parties so notified.
- (d) The City Clerk stated that a sealed bid was to be submitted before June 13, 1975, on the existing post office building if the City has any interest in the property. Mayor Burdette appointed the four aldermen as a committee to determine the bid.
7. Motion by Ald. Collins to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
