

1. Call to order by Mayor Burdette.
2. Invocation given by Rev. John Allen, pastor Belmont Baptist Church.
3. Minutes of the regular meeting of Feb. 10, 1975 read and approved.
4. There being no comments by the Mayor, Aldermen or the Public, the meeting proceeded with old business.
  - (a) A new swimming pool ordinance regarding the fencing of residential pools was given a first reading.
  - (b) The Civil Defense Ordinance amending the ordinance of May 22, 1967 and having been read at the council meeting on Feb. 10, 1975 and having received no public descention was approved after a motion by Ald. Cox and 2nd by Ald. Lewis.
  - (c) A six months trailer permit was given to Mrs. Donald Reynolds of 103 Ola Street after a motion by Ald. Lewis and a 2nd by Ald. Cox.
5. New Business:
  - (a) The City Clerk recommened a change in the office hours from the present 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. - Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday - 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. - Wednesday & Saturday to 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday - 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. on Saturday. The office would be closed all day on Wednesday. The Clerk recommened that the change in hours be published 2 weeks before becoming effective if approved by the Council. A motion was made by Ald. Lewis to adopt the the change as recommened beginning March 17, 1975, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
  - (b) The Clerk read a letter of commendation concerning Rep. Thomas Shanahan from Mr. C. L. Smith, Jr., of Griffin, Ga. The letter as hereto attached becomes a permanent part of the minutes.
  - (c) Roy Fox stated that the City and County would be getting some State Aid for the paving of city streets in the near future. The Council designated the streets to be paved in priorities of:

  - (d) Bids on a new 1975 Police Car with a large engine were open-  
ed from Prater Ford and Roy Davis. Prater's bid was \$4406.00 and Davis' bid was \$4712.00. Ald. Lewis made the motion to accept the low bid of \$4406.00, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved. The Mayor stated that several arrests had been made at the land-fill for dumping after hours. The Mayor stated that proper advertising on the hours the fill was open had been made. He said several signs were on the property designating the hours as well, and urged the public to respect these. The Mayor and Council asked the City Clerk to contact each cab company and request a current copy of their liability insurance, and to write Mr. Al Burrus, Mr. Ben B. Ross and Mr. Tom Shanahan regarding their efforts on H.B. 31 to establish the new municipal electric authority.
