

1. Call to order, invocation by Mayor Burdette.
2. The minutes of the regular May 26, 1975, and special June 5, 1975 meetings were read and approved.
3. Mayor Burdette announced that the regular meeting of June 23, 1975, would be postponed until June 30, 1975, since the GMA convention would be held that week. He also announced that there would be no City Court on June 23.
4. Aldermen's Comments: Ald Collins stated that the recreation commission had met on June 2, 1975. The open house and dedication of new facilities will be held June 15, 1975. A full copy of the minutes will be sent to the City to become a part of the records.
5. Old Business: (a) The City Clerk explained that the motel owners had been invited to the meeting to discuss the Hotel-Motel Tax. The Clerk explained what the tax would be and how and when they would be collected. Several motel owners, Mr. Tony LaPort, Mr. Alton Holcomb, and Mr. Nicholas were all in favor of not having the tax. They explained that since Cartersville was not collecting the tax it would hurt their business, which is still below normal. Commissioner DeFoor and Mayor Burdette and the Council stated that both the County and City did not want to hurt their business, but that both municipalities have such limited sources of revenue each new source must be examined. The Council and Commissioner decided to drop the subject at present, but consider later should the surrounding cities and counties implement the tax. (b) A motion was made by Ald. Padgett to grant a water tap to Billy Parker of Weberdale Heights, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved. (c) The Clerk gave the new proposed dog ordinance a first reading. (d) The drain ditches at the housing authority were discussed. Asst. City Manager Roy Fox had a cost estimate of \$35,319.00 for the project. Due to the lack of funds, the council postponed any action and asked that the project request be considered again in July, 1975.
6. New Business: (a) A motion was made by Ald. Cox to authorize the 201 sewer study with funding of 75% on a grant program, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved. (b) Sewerage taps for customers outside the corporate city limits were discussed but no action was taken. (c) Jack Holland asked for a zoning variance in order to build a building within 5 to 7 feet of his back property line. Ald. Lewis made the motion to grant the variance provided written approval was received by the City from the affected property owners before work was begun, 2nd by Ald. Collins and approved. (d) Ald. Cox made a motion to grant a six months permit to Thurman Roberts for a hot dog stand on Line St. and Park Ave. pro provided his past due taxes on his home for the last three years were paid and all City codes and ordinances were met and observed. 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved.

(e) A motion was made by Ald. Collins to grant an additional \$63,200.00 to the School Board above the budget - \$13,200.00 to be returned to the City when received from the State, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.


(f) A motion was made by Ald. Collins to adopt the attached resolution pertaining to State Grant No. 75-SW-046, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.

(g) James Owens requested a reduction or delay in payment of an invoice for sewerage installation. The Council would not reduce the invoice, but did agree to postpone the due date until the first of the year.

(h) The 200 ft. sewer tap of Al Cadenhead of Modern Fibers is to be studied carefully before a decision is made. Roy Fox to report on finding at June 30 meeting.

7. Motion to adjourn by Ald. Padgett, 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved.
