

1. Call to order by Mayor Burdette, invocation by City Chaplin John Allen.
2. Minutes of the Oct. 13 regular meeting and Oct. 21 special meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: Mayor Burdette thanked each member of the audience for attending the Council meeting. He stated that the same rules and regulations would be followed concerning Halloween as had been observed in the past few years allowing only those children in the fifth grade or below to trick or treat. The police will be patrolling all areas.
4. New Business: (a) Mayor Burdette stated that the Dept. of Transportation had presented plans on Oct. 24 requesting changes on Wall Street, Court Street, several intersections and affecting on the street parking in the downtown area. He recognized some 39 merchants and citizens in the audience that were opposed to the changes in the downtown "on the street parking". Mr. Burdette stated that he and the entire Council were opposed to any changes decreasing parking in the downtown area. The Mayor asked Roy Fox to explain some of the changes that could be made to facilitate the flow of traffic. Allowing parallel parking on the east side of Maple to Hicks Street in areas not connected with intersections with a left turning lane. Remove parking meters in front of library. King Street to Park Avenue - angular parking north side with three lane traffic, center being left turn only lanes. From post office building to Line St. have three lanes of traffic, center being left turning lane.  
(b) Mayor Burdette stated that Georgia Power had requested a 35 year franchise with the City. He asked that this matter be continued until the next meeting to allow time to study the proposal thoroughly.  
(c) A motion was made by Ald. DeFoor; Three J's Steak House, Jim Stone; Bill Holbert, Bill Holbert. Wine: Troy's Package Store, John Bell; Smitty's Beverage Store, Clifford Smith; Red Bud Liquor Store, Champ Kelley. Liquor: American Legion Post 47; V.F.W.; Red Bud Liquor Store, Champ Kelley; Ray's Package Store, John Ray, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.

- 5. Old Business: (a) A motion was made by Ald. Collins to approve the water plant modification plans as submitted by TLM Associates, 2nd by Ald. Padgett and approved.
- (b) Mayor Burdette asked that the naming of the post office property be continued until the next meeting to allow each council member time to consider the question.
- (c) Ald. Padgett made a motion to approve water taps for Allen McCoy off the Red Bud Road; Richard Stevens across from KOA Campgrounds on the Red Bud Road, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
- (d) A motion was made by Ald. Padgett to waive the second reading of the amendment to change the business license tax ordinance and approve as was read at the Oct. 13, 1975, meeting, 2nd by Ald. Cox and approved.
- (e) Mayor Burdette stated that the Coosa Valley Area Planning bill for the current years membership had not been paid. After discussion, Ald. Padgett made a motion to approve the bill, 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved.
- (f) Motion by Ald. Padgett to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Lewis and approved.
