

1. Call to order by Mayor Burdette, invocation by City Chaplin John Allen.
2. Minutes of the Nov. 10, 1975, meeting were read and approved.
3. Mayor's Comments: Mayor Burdette stated that Ald. Padgett's wife would have surgery on Nov. 25, therefore he was not able to attend the meeting and Ald. Lewis was working.
4. Aldermen's Comments: Ald. Cox reported on the black bird problem on Second Avenue, River and King Streets. After discussion Mayor Burdette asked that Harold Kirby and Jack Bell check with property owners for permission to clear underbrush and hopefully to destroy their roosting area. Results to be reported at the next meeting.
5. New Business: (a) City Engineer Hobgood indicated that for the first time we were beginning to have a sludge problem. He expressed the desire to experiment with hauling liquid sludge to local farm land or city property rather than using drying beds. The expense involved would not be that much. Mr. Hobgood had borrowed a 2000 gallon tank from the County and would like to use an old chassis from the Street Dept. that needs replacing. The cost of a new truck would be approximately \$7,000.00. Mayor Burdette asked that bids be secured and brought to the next council meeting.  
(b) City Manager Edwards stated that Ald. Lewis had been approached to allow private individuals to enter the industrial landfill for industrial supplies that could be used. Our present policy does not allow anyone to enter and take out articles previously left. The Council felt that no exceptions should be made. Mr. Edwards reported that a Mr. Patterson had approached the City and County about buying the 150 ft. frontage at the landfill. The City declined the offer.  
(c) The Clerk announced several upcoming meetings:

(d) Ald. Collins made a motion to install 1000 ft. of 6" PVC pipe at approximately \$1.00 per ft. to the area by Doyle Phillip's which serves approximately seven homes, 2nd by Ald. Cox and voted on affirmatively by Mayor Burdette.

(e) Ald. Cox made a motion to install 250 ft. of 2" line to allow a three way feed into Sugar Valley area, 2nd by Ald. Collins and voted on affirmatively by Mayor Burdette.
