


APRIL 24, 1967 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL - ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of April 10 meeting read and approved.
3. Mrs. Pearl Shanahan requested the Council to increase its contribution to the Calhoun-Gordon Co. Library from \$2,000 per annum to \$4,000 per annum payable quarterly and retroactive to Jan. 1, '67. Ald. Norton moved that this be done; Ald. David 2nd, voted and passed.
Mrs. Bonnie Reeves and Mrs. Dot Callahan, representing the Sequoyah Garden Club, were present seeking \$500 for landscaping of the library grounds. It was suggested that the clerk write a letter for these ladies asking a donation of \$50 each from a number of industries in the city and county.
4. Richard Mitzelfelt, Public Health Sanitarian for Gordon County, asked Council to cooperate with the Health Dept. by refusing to install water meters for property owners without a permit from the health dept. He said this would give him better control of septic tanks and sanitary sewer lines installed in the county. At Ald. Woods suggestion, the Council agreed to this on a trial basis.
5. Mrs. Beulah Holland told Council that she understood her claim against the City was settled when the Supreme Court of Georgia ruled for the City, but she thought the Council should know of her condition as a result of the accident on Hunt Drive in September of 1964. Mrs. Holland said she had undergone surgery this year and faced additional surgery soon; she had been in a brace since the accident and unable to work without taking medicine. Council advised Mrs. Holland to furnish the clerk a list of her expenses not covered by insurance and promised to consider the matter further.
6. Ald. David heard in regard to the open ditch on the South and West sides of Fain Cemetery. This to be taken care of by curb and gutter and widening of the street at city expense.
7. Supt. Owens presented bids on airport hangar. Raymond King Construction Co. bid \$14,000 and Garner Bros. of Rome, \$17,600. Ald. David moved to accept the low bid, 2nd by Ald. King, voted and passed. (Gordon Co. to pay half the cost.)
8. Application of N. D. Jackson of Dalton for a license for a pawn shop read and referred to Ald. King, chairman of the license committee.
9. On motion of Ald. King with second from Ald. Norton, Council voted to update all codes by approving latest issues.
10. Ald. King moved to adjourn, seconded by Ald. David and done.
