


AUGUST 28, 1967 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL, ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of August 14 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. Norton asked and received permission to spend approximately \$500.00 for Christmas Decorations.
4. Ald. Woods heard with reference to the lack of sewage facilities on the extreme north end of the city. No action taken.
5. Ald. David said the library board had requested an additional \$4,000.00 for furniture for the new library. Action deferred.
6. Supt. Owens reported that Skipper Industries is still anxious to acquire city sewage. Council advised that the property must first be annexed to the city.
7. President Buddy Davis, of the Calhoun Jaycees, presented Ken Shaver, chairman of the JC teen committee who explained the JC's project to sponsor dances for teen agers. Mr. Shaver said the tennis courts would be used for the first few dances and requested the city furnish police chaperone. Ald. King agreed that the city should have an off duty officer there for two or three dances and then reappraise the situation. Council agreed.
8. Ald. Woods said garbage being transported to the city dump from outside the city was littering streets en route to the dump. Mayor Dickinson said those responsible would be fined if apprehended.
9. Clerk advised that Mrs. Ross (Beulah) Holland had asked the city for assistance in paying bills incurred as a result of an injury allegedly sustained due to negligence of city employees. Council instructed the clerk to inform Mrs. Holland that since this case had been adjudicated by the Supreme Court of Georgia, there remains no legal way for the city to monetarily assist her.
10. Clerk presented Burroughs Corp. proposal to replace the city's billing machine for \$5,695.60. Ald. Woods moved to accept the offer, 2nd by Ald. Norton, voted and passed.
11. Clerk reported that Metropolitan Life Ins. Co. and Travelers Ins. Co. had submitted plans for group insurance superior to the city's present carrier, Home Life Ins. Co. The clerk said the Metropolitan offered more coverage for less money. Ald. King moved to drop Home Life and enter contract with Metropolitan effective Oct. 1, 2nd by Ald. Norton, voted and passed.
12. Clerk said he hoped to have the totals of the tax digest by Sept. 11 meeting.
13. Chief Roberts told council that a pedestrian gate should be installed at the Line St. Elementary School. Ald. King suggested that the Chief and School Supt. Gus Cate work this out.
14. Ald. Norton moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. King and done.
