

FEB. 13, 1967 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT
EXCEPT ALD. TOM B. DAVID

1. Rev. Mack Tribble, pastor of the First Methodist Church, delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of regular meeting of Jan. 23 and called meeting of Jan. 27 read and approved.
3. Rev. Tribble said his church wished to recognize the policemen and firemen of the city with a special program Sunday, April 16. Ald. King moved that the council approve, 2nd by Ald. Norton and passed.
4. Rev. Tribble stated that his wife had asked him to request that the center line be re-painted on E. Line St. Supt. Owens instructed to have this done.
5. Mr. J. C. Boyd and Bobby Toles, AIA, representing the city housing authority, requested council to pass the Housing Compliance Code. Ald. Woods made the motion to adopt the code, Ald. King seconded, voted and passed.
6. Ald. King then moved for adoption of the Workable Program for Community Improvement. Ald. Norton 2nd, voted and passed.
7. Supt. Owens estimated the cost of a garbage truck body at \$4,860 with six containers costing an additional \$1,362. Ald. Norton made motion to purchase, Ald. King 2nd; voted and passed. Council then approved an ad in local paper reminding citizens that covered garbage cans are required.
8. Ald. King said the city had gone to considerable expense to offer residents of the city better fire protection and recommended that the Council adhere strictly to regulations of the SE Underwriters prohibiting response to calls outside the city, except to public bldgs. and mutual aid calls to neighboring cities. Council concurred.
9. Ald. King announced that the police dept. had hired Janie Aker and Evelene Dew to work school crossings.
10. Supt. Owens reported cost of sidewalk on McConnell Road to be \$600. Ald. Norton moved to pave this walk when this ^{2/3} amount is on deposit in the clerk's office. Ald. King 2nd, voted and passed.
11. Mayor Dickinson said the L & N had stopped blocking railroad crossings in town and apparently Ted Ward and Tom Poarch had kept their promise.
12. Co. Comm. Everett DeFoor said he and Ald. David had discussed the acquisition of the triangle of land at intersection of College St. & US 41 N for a fire station site. Mr. DeFoor further stated that the county had employed 2 persons to maintain tax records and asked that the city participate in paying their salaries. No action.
13. Clerk presented Tom Shanahan's bill for ^{\$1,000 for} services in the Mrs. Ross (Beulah) Holland case which was finally decided by the Supreme Court of Ga. in favor of the city. Ald. King moved to pay this bill, Ald. Norton 2nd, voted and passed.
14. Clerk heard in regard to Mrs. H. E. Baker's request that the city repair or replace her water heater, which was damaged as a result of an interruption of service by the city. Council said to install element provided Mrs. Baker buy same.
15. Ald. King moved to adjourn, Ald. Woods 2nd and done.
