

NOV. 27, 1967 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON,
ALD. KING & WOODS PRESENT; AID. DAVID & NORTON ABSENT


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of Nov. 13 meeting read and approved.
3. Several downtown merchants, namely James Keene, E. C. Pate, Alton Holcomb, Royal Teague and Clarence Burger, appeared before the Council seeking information on the proposed parking lot between Park Ave. and the railroad and Court and Oothcaloga Sts. Mayor Dickinson advised that no action had been taken and none would until the state awards the new lease on the property. The group discussed installing parking meters along the west side of Park Avenue from Court St. north to entrance of library parking lot. Ald. King moved that this be done, Ald. Woods seconded and the motion was approved.
4. Clerk read petition of Mary Will M. Stephens requesting annexation of her property beginning at driveway between Standard and Humble Oil stations and running westerly approx. 1,000 ft. and south 450 ft. along Red Bud Rd. Ald. King moved to accept this property into the city, 2nd by Ald. Woods, voted and passed.
5. Council declined offer of Aldon Rug Mills to paint the standpipe at Sugar Valley.
6. Ald. King moved to adjourn, Ald. Woods seconded and Mayor Dickinson declared the meeting adjourned.
