



FEB. 26, 1968 - REGULAR MEETING CITY COUNCIL, ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of regular meeting of Feb. 12 and called meeting of Feb. 15 read and approved.
3. Mr. W. Parks Garrett, an employee of the L & N RR, asked Council to draw resolution to ICC requesting a public hearing on L & N's petition to withdraw from service two passenger trains. Council decided such a resolution could not be justified before an ICC examiner since the train in question does not stop here and very few are using the rails for passenger service.
4. Mr. J. B. Tullis and Mr. Jim Burns of Southern Bell Tel & Tel explained the company's need for a lot near the airport. Council agreed to lease or sell the lot, but asked Mr. Tullis to check with his company to determine if they would lease it.
5. Ald. David moved to increase the salary of the City Recorder from \$100 to \$150 monthly. Ald. Holland seconded and the motion was voted on and passed.
6. Ald. David said he had received complaints on all day parking of autos at the library. Council instructed Chief Roberts to take steps to stop this practice.
7. Ald. Woods heard in regard to J. W. Thomas' request to purchase 8 ft. off the South side of the Civic Center lot. After discussion, Council decided not to sell.
8. Ald. Holland said Brown-Woods Barber Shop had complained of employees of nearby businesses parking all day and thereby depriving prospective customers of space near their shop. Mayor Dickinson appointed Mr. Holland and Ald. David to seek a solution to the problem.
9. Application for malt beverage package license of Donald E. Meador for Red Bud Rd at Columbus Cir (west) read by the clerk.
10. Supt. Owens was instructed to ask for bids on 2 cars and 2 trucks. Council re-affirmed policy of requiring outside city bidder to be at least \$50 under inside bidders on each vehicle.
11. The license request of Jerry Clark, dba Little Giant Food Store, for package beer sales was tabled.
12. Mayor Dickinson read a letter from Mrs. John L. (Ginny) Reese, commending the Council for its part in the construction of the new library.
13. Petition for annexation of R. M. Dobbs and T. B. Lance property consisting of 18.8 acres and 2 parcels consisting of 10.2 acres of Calhoun Investors, Inc. Ald. Woods made the motion to accept this property between 53 By-Pass and W. May St., L & N RR and US 41 into the city. Ald. Holland seconded, voted on and passed.
14. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
