

FEB. 15, 1968 - CALLED MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON, AID. DAVID, HOLLAND AND WOODS PRESENT; AID. HEAD ABSENT.

Bert Lance, President of the Calhoun National Bank, explained he had requested this meeting to reduce to writing some of the commitments made to representatives of a manufacturer interested in locating a plant here.

Alderman David moved that the city agree to the following:

1. To extend sanitary sewer and water mains and electric power to the plant site at no cost to the company.
2. To make a concerted effort to annex the proposed plant site if the company exercises their option to purchase.
3. Upon annexation of property, it will be zoned for industrial use.
4. The company will not forfeit the right to drill water wells for industrial consumption.
5. The city will, when requested so to do, relocate, within a reasonable time, the water main that traverses the property.
6. To permit a spur railroad track across the northwest side of the airport property.
7. To pass no ordinances regulating height restrictions in airport flight pattern following purchase of property by company.

Alderman Holland seconded the motion and it was approved by unanimous vote of the City Council.

Alderman Woods moved to adjourn, seconded by Alderman Holland, voted on and passed.
