ALD. DAVID AND WOODS PRESENT; ALD. HEAD & HOLLAND
ABSENT.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance read his original "Prayer For Peace" on this Veterans Day.
2. Minutes of the Oct. 28 meeting read and approved.
3. William A. Shirley, 218 Calhoun Avenue, requested Council to open King St. from Calhoun Ave. south to W. Line St. and north to Water Works Rd. (also known as Henderson Bend Rd. and Mauldin Rd.) Ald. Woods said the city should proceed with plans to open this street.
4. Joe Apperson and Jerry Caylor asked Council to repeal Code Section 13-8 & permit coin operated machines for amusement and skill only. Council to consider and advise.
5. Council briefly discussed opening and additional 900 ft. of Meadow Lane.
6. The city section on Oothcaloga St. was discussed. Supt. Owens said the rights of way are being procured at the present time.
7. Ald. David read a letter from the Federal Aviation Administration with reference to the rail spur on Airport property.
8. Ald. David read a letter from Mr. C. O. Dickey of the First National Bank of Pulaski, Tenn. regarding cable TV. (Copy attached.)
9. Clerk read a letter from Rev. Henry L. Foster of College Park requesting permission to preach in the park on Sat., Nov. 30. Council denied the request and instructed the clerk to notify Mr. Foster via telephone.
10. Supt. Owens stated that Gilbert Hunt's ^{WALK} ~~drive~~way at 103 McConnell Rd. would be fixed to permit him to come and go.
11. Petitions for annexation of 2 parcels of property owned by Oothcaloga Realty & Investment Corp. and the house and lot of Charles S. Jackson were accepted on motion of Ald. David, 2nd by Ald. Woods. Ralph Kirby's petition not accepted because his property is not contiguous to property now in the city.
12. Supt. Owens reported that the mfrs. on Industrial Blvd. had employed J. C. Maddox and that he and J. C. were working on extending the city limits to the Blvd.
13. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Woods and done.
