

MARCH 25, 1968 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of March 11 meeting read and approved.
3. M. C. Dobson asked Council to permit him, and others, to place certain coin operated amusement machines in business locations in the city. He said all the machines were legal according to the Supreme Court of Georgia. No Action.
4. Council approved the request of Bill Stocks of Radio Station WEBS, to hold an egg hunt in the park on Easter Sunday.
5. Ald. David said it had been called to his attention that boys were riding improperly lighted bicycles into the street at Ford's Supermarket and the housing project. Chief Roberts was instructed by the Mayor to arrest violators.
6. Council authorized CD Director Tom David to spend up to \$150 on the Rescue truck.
7. Ald. Woods moved adoption of the resolution with reference to city bonds and coupons lost in the mail by owner. Ald. Holland seconded, voted and passed.
8. Council discussed new jail and recreation building.
9. Ald. David offered to purchase the Civic Center Bldg. and lot on behalf of the Calhoun National Bank for \$60,000.00. Council agreed to postpone action until April 8 meeting.
10. Ald. Woods offered a motion to charge all commercial customers 1¢ per KWH on all consumption in excess of 50,000 KWH effective with April 5 billing. Ald. Head 2nd, voted on and passed.
11. Ald. Holland suggested that the Comm. of Roads and Revenues of Gordon County and the public be given notice that on and after May 1, 1968, no garbage, trash or waste will be permitted to be deposited in the city dump, except that from inside the corporate limits of Calhoun. Council agreed.
12. Ald. Head inquired as to progress on parking lot on railroad property. Clerk advised that no reply had been received from the L & N.
13. Ald. Head said he would get the city attorney to check the contract proposals on the cable TV.
14. Bids opened on two police cars with Roy Davis Chevrolet-Olds the apparent low bidder. Ald. David moved to accept the low bid, 2nd by Ald. Holland voted and passed. Bids were then opened on two trucks (cab and chassis) for the Street Dept. with Roy Davis Chevy-Olds again the low bidder. Ald. Head made the motion to purchase from Roy Davis, 2nd by Ald. Woods, voted and passed.
15. Supt. Owens recommended that McConnell Road be curbed and guttered.
16. The property of M. J. Gallman on the north side of the Red Bud Road at Columbus Circle (west) was annexed by petition. Motion by Ald. Holland, 2nd by Ald. David.
17. Mayor Dickinson instructed the clerk to notify all funeral directors and the County Fire Dept. to observe posted speed limits and to curtail the use of sirens, especially in the vicinity of the Gordon Co. Hospital.
18. Ald. Woods moved to adjourn, Ald. David seconded, voted and done.
