

AUG. 26, 1968 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of August 5 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. Woods said Nelson Warren had offered to clean and paint the City's reservoirs and standpipes at the following prices: Resaca-\$170, Hillcrest-\$150, Sugar Valley-\$150, Dale Ave-\$150, Brogdon Mtn-\$150 (including re-lettering) and \$120 for the clear well. Mr. Woods moved that City Supt. James Owens and Water & Light Supt. Jack Bell contact Mr. Warren, purchase the paint and supervise the work. Ald. Holland seconded the motion. Ald. David asked if Mr. Warren carried insurance and was advised that the city would not be liable in case of an accident. The motion was then voted on and passed.
4. Ald. Head reported that no decision had been reached by his cable TV committee. Mr. Head announced that the committee to study ways and means of serving Industrial Blvd. ~~xxx~~ with sanitary sewage had agreed on a proposal to prospective users, but, at the request of Bill Greene, consulting engineer, the plan will not be presented until Mr. Greene has time to evaluate the proposal and its effect on the sewer project as a whole.
5. Ald. Head moved to accept the petitions for annexation of the property of Dr. & Mrs. Charles F. Giddens, Perry C. Moore, James P. Hammontree and David Chattam, provided the property is contiguous to property now in the city. The motion was seconded by Ald. David, voted on and passed.
6. Bill Greene, of Wiedeman & Singleton, Engineers, recommended to the Council that they authorize him to proceed with plans to add four million gallons per day capacity to the water filtration plant. Mr. Greene discussed at length the sewage treatment plant and its cost and said he would give Lex Jolley a call in order that he might arrange the financing of the project.
7. Supt. Owens reported that the proposed water main extension on Herrington Bend Road had been delayed due to some difficulties between County Comm. Everett DeFoor and the contractor.
8. Ald. David moved to adjourn; 2nd by Ald. Head and done.
