

SEPT. 9, 1968-REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH MAYOR DICKINSON,  
ALD. DAVID, HEAD AND HOLLAND PRESENT, ALD. WOODS ABSENT.


1. Chaplain T. J. Lance delivered the invocation.
2. Minutes of Aug. 26 meeting read and approved.
3. Council discussed installation of water meters and extension of water mains in the county and decided to postpone all requests for water service in the county until an agreement could be reached with County Commissioner Everett DeFoor. Council agreed to continue to allow the county to use city water for fire fighting and road construction at no charge, but insist that the county notify the City Supt. or the Water & Light Supt. to insure an adequate supply of water to regular consumers.
4. Ald. David asked all present to attend an important Civil Defense meeting to be held at the Calhoun National Bank on Wednesday, Sept. 25.
5. Ald. David moved that all employees be re-imbursed by the city for clothing or personal effects damaged or lost in the line of duty. Ald. Holland 2nd, voted on and passed.
6. Supt. Owens said there was enough interest in the construction of a hangar at the airport to warrant serious consideration. Ald. David moved that Mr. Owens investigate cost of building and anticipated income and report his findings. Ald. Holland seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.
7. Supt. Owens reported that the extension of Louise Avenue to connect with Elm at Oak as requested by several residents in the area would be difficult to achieve because of the difficulty in procuring rights of way. No action taken.
8. Heavy and slow traffic at the East Side Elementary School was discussed and the problem assigned to Supt. Owens.
9. Ald. David moved to accept the petition for annexation of the Henry E. Hollands. Ald. Head 2nd and the motion was approved.
10. Ald. David moved to adjourn, 2nd by Ald. Holland and done.
