


FEB. 24, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

1. Chaplain Jack Lance asked City School Supt. Gus Cate to read several verses from the Book of Mathew, then Chaplain Lance opened the meeting with prayer.
2. Minutes of the Feb. 10 meeting were read and approved.
3. Ald. David made a motion to purchase the South Calhoun Baptist Church, Ald. Norton Seconded- price of \$19,000.00- after discussion the motion was tabled.
4. Supt. Gus Cate discussed school problems and needs with Council at length. He said the board had decided against asking council to buy the S. Calhoun Baptist Church for office space since they had more pressing needs.
5. Council instructed Police Chief Roberts to close Jerry Steele's Garden Club Inn since he had no business license and council had received complaints on the operation of this business.
6. Ald. David read a letter from Mr. John H. Bennett, aviation representative of the Georgia Department of Industry and Trade, detailing steps to be taken immediately if Calhoun and Gordon Co. are to get any federal aid during fiscal 1965. Ald. David said the Dan Patty farm was still available and he felt an option should be taken. No action at this meeting.
7. The proposed Negro swimming pool was discussed and Supt. Owens said he had not definitely decided on the location or the plans.
8. Supt. Owens said there were only 8 prospective customers on the Fairview-Sugar Valley and 10 are required to pay for the main. He also brought before the Council the water main extension toward Hill City requested by Mr. Murray C. Gresham and said Oothcaloga Industrial Development, Inc. would sell the City four acres of land on Pine St. for \$15,000.00. This land to be for future school use. After discussion, no action was taken on any item.
9. Council declined to annex the property of Olin Bagley, Jack E. Fain, Raymond Ross and James P. Hammontree.
10. Ald. King moved to accept the petition of Mr. Tom Curtis requesting annexation of his house and the building housing his upholstery shop. Ald. David seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.
11. Mrs. Della Warren's petition seeking annexation of 4 Acres of property on the Red Bud Road was accepted on motion of Ald, King and second of Ald. Norton which passed without a dissenting vote.
12. Council voted to pay Mr. J. T. Woods, Sr. \$30.00 which he had paid to have a sewer line unstopped that should have been done by city workmen.
13. Ald. King moved to adjourn the meeting, Ald. David seconded the motion and the Mayor ordered the meeting adjourned.
