

SEPTEMBER 14, 1964 - REGULAR MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

1. Chaplain T. J. Lance opened the meeting with scripture reading and prayer.
2. Minutes of August 24 meeting read and approved.
3. Ald. David said he had been advised that there were no fire hydrants on Valley Circle. Supt. Owens said all houses were close enough to a fire plug to meet underwriters requirements.
4. Ald. David requested paving of high school drive way. Supt. Owens said he would schedule this work.
5. Ald. David reported that he had to seek another location for the proposed airstrip. Council told Mr. David to proceed provided no City funds were expended.
6. Ald. King heard in regard to Mr. Herbert King encroaching on City street right of way. Ald. King said he had received a complaint that Mr. King's shrubbery and tree were partially on the right of way and made driving on Sequoyah Terrace hazardous. The clerk was instructed to write Mr. King.
7. Ald. King informed Council that Mr. Truman D. Henley, formerly with the Atlanta Police Dept., had been employed as a policeman.
8. Mr. Burton J. Bell's resignation from the Coosa Valley Area Planning & Development Assn. was accepted effective Sept. 30. Mr. Ronald F. Chance was appointed to succeed Mr. Bell.
9. Council discussed property sites for the proposed elementary school.
10. Supt. Owens reported on the GMA Power Section meeting in Macon on August 31.
11. Supt. Owens heard in regard to Oak St. RR crossing. After discussion, Mayor Dickinson said Council would decide this on Sept. 28.
12. Mr. E. Frank Walraven, Jr. was denied payment of \$200 he had requested for five feet of his property he claims was taken in improvement of Victory Drive.

13. Ald. King moved adjournment, Ald. David seconded the motion and the meeting was declared adjourned by Mayor Dickinson.
